I Edmund Edward of Robertson County and State of Tennessee planter being in good health perfect mind thank God therefor calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul to God that give it and as for my body I am committed to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the discretion of my executor & whomever it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give bequeath and dispose of the same in the following manner & form improved I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth all my land with all other property of which I am possessed at the day of my death during her lifetime or widowhood to use and dispose of as shee thinks best & at her death I mind I give and bequeath to my daughter Lilly Davis my negro boy Sam with a East and two hundred dollars in horse flesh or some other property that is most handy to carry -

Also I give to my daughter Nancy Jordan & the heirs of her body a certain tract or parcel of land in Robertson County lying on the West side of the middle fork of Red River and between the land of James East & Abraham Moon Beginning on the West boundary line of said tract of land about thirty yards South of the ground where Alexander Chesnut & wife were buried at a red oak blazed three ways running Eastwardly to a red oak called the big red oak blazed for & aft thence across the barren field to a red oak for & aft thence to the river hill to a post oak for & aft about thirty steps North

west of the Indian grave thence to a white oak and the river blazed three ways thence up the river to the Beginning.
