Thomas Chesterfield Jackson late formerly of the County of Warren and Commonwealth of Kentucky died by his last will and Testament bearing date September month 1822 give and bequeath unto Joseph Fort, William Belsack, Elizabeth Larrison, Richard Smith, Elias Fort & Jeff Fort his mother's brothers and sisters a tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Robertson and State of Tennessee which land was given to said Chesterfield Jackson's mother Esther Jackson de'd by a deed from Elias Fort his father dated the 29th June 1798 bounded as follows Beginning at a hickory running East one hundred fifty two poles to a hickory & three gums thence North two hundred and fourteen poles to a red oak and dogwood thence West one hundred and fifty two poles to a Red oak & poplar thence South two hundred & fourteen poles to the beginning containing two hundred acres of land more or less - Now agreeable to the last Will and Testament of said Chesterfield Jackson late as aforesaid, We Joseph Fort, William Belsack (for his wife Elizabeth Belsack) Elias Fort and Jeff Fort have mutually agreed do by these presents divide said tract of land of two hundred acres mentioned above into six equal lots or parts agreeable to the plat annexed we have employed the said Shauken who did on the 4th day of January 1827 proceeded to survey and mark
