lying in Davidson County containing three hundred acres. Beginning
at the corner of Mulberry Lick survey at a Mulberry thence North
eighty four poles to a cedar and two along thence West one hundred
and thirty and a half poles to an Ironwood sapling thence North
one hundred and twenty three poles to a hickory and Ironwood
Ranabata. Ranabata line two hundred and thirty eight with the said
Ranabata line two hundred forty six and a half poles to a sugar tree on
the bank of Cumberland River then down said river to the mouth of
a small branch to a sassafras dy m and oak on the lower side
of said branch on the bank of the river then South to the lake
line a Walnut ash and Ironwood. thence West with the lake

Secondly I give to my wife Lucy Holman during her natural life as widow and forty acres of land my plantation including all my houses with five acres to timber to support it also my negro man Jack after my wife's death or marriage I will that my negro man Jack be sold and divided between my six sons James P. Holman Patrick Holman Calvin S. Holman Joseph Holman Anderson Holman George S. Holman equally also I give my wife two horses and harness more and one dark bay filly three cows and calves one bar shorn place and goss one ox and mending hoe one hearse one cupboard and furniture and all my beds and four nature sitting chairs and kitchen

For a term of years and years possession I give to my daughter Rachel Holman one negro girl named Fanny to her and her heirs forever - I give to my daughter Sally Holman one negro girl named Charity to her and her heirs forever

I give my six sons to test James P. Holman Patrick Holman Calvin S. Holman Joseph Holman Anderson Holman George S. Holman and all my land containing five hundred and twenty acres to be equally divided between them I give to my daughter Betty Holman one hearse and all the rest of my property to be sold and after paying my just debts is paid to be equally divided between my six sons and lastly I do appoint my friends Richard Schwaethane and Richard Benson Executors to this my last will and testament hereby making all others or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made in writing Wherof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5 day of May 1838

will beloved daughter Eliza Jean Payne and her heirs here-
 After I give and bequeath to each of my children herebefore
 mentioned one part or share and furniture at the discretion of my
 Executor hereafter mentioned to be as near of an equality as
 they can do my house hold and kitchen furniture to be for the
 use of my wife and family and after the death of my wife
 beloved wife Jean Payne my house hold and kitchen furna-
 -ture to be equally divided amongst my several children
 herebefore mentioned -

Item 5th the balance of my stock horses cattle sheep hogs and
