The conditions of this obligation is such that whereas the above bound Richard R. Powell Sheriff of the County of said is appointed collector of public tax in said County of Robertson for the present year. Now if the said Richard R. Powell shall well and truly collect the State County poor and Levy tax in said County of Robertson for the year 1832 and pay over to the State Treasurer and County Trustees said taxes as they are severally due at such time as pointed out by the act of Assembly then this obligation to be void otherwise to be and remain in full force and virtue according to the true intent and meaning hereof

 and constitute this my last will testament and declare and
 particularly wish that all and every person or persons may
 receive it as such that I recommend my soul to God
 who gave it my body to be buried in a Christian like
 manner and as touching my worldly with which God
 has blessed me in this life I desire it should be distributed
 in the following manner to wit, I give to my loving
 wife Elizabeth Suter the use of the plantation where I now
