I Charles Seale of the County of Robertson and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and disposing memory for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow on me with I give and bequeath the same in manner following: that is to say: First I give and bequeath to my two sons James Seale and William Seale the tract of land whereon I now live lying on a branch of Red River being in the County and State above mentioned containing four hundred and twenty acres to be equally divided between my two sons above mentioned in four parts, I give and bequeath to my son James Seale the lower improvement with the land from the lower end of the tract to the upper improvement, I give to my son William Seale the upper improvement to contain an equal quantity of land with the lower improvement the balance of the tract of land to be equally divided between my two sons above mentioned that each shall have an equal share of timber which land I give and bequeath to them and their heirs forever. my wife Seabell Seale is to have her support out of the said land and the balance of the estate during her natural life I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Seale one hundred and fifty dollars in money the balance of my property after my wife Seabell Seale's death to be sold and the and the money with what money is in my hands to be equally divided between my two daughters William and William and Mary Seale except the price of my negroes that I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Seale, which I give and bequeath to them and their heirs forever the property that I have already given to my children before the date of this will to remain theirs I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend James Seale & William Seale Executors of my last will and testament hereby revoking all other former wills or testaments by me heretofore made
