Nathaniel Fullerton's Revision

In obedience to an order to us directed from the Mississippi Court of Chancery and Justice of Session for Robertson County Met on the 26th of November 1833 and divided the lands of Nathaniel Fullerton deceased completed the same on the 3rd day succeeding and found the sum to be agreeable to the first lease a manum where each is numbered and third name and quantity which they respectively drew annexed to each plot & number with the Beginning & corners & distance which will now fully appear as follows.
