I Samuel Hudgings of the County of Robertson & State of Tennessee being weak in body but sound in mind and memory and considering the shortness of this mortal life giving God thanks do make and publish this my last will and testament in the following manner & form, first I give and bequeath my soul to God to almighty God who gave it my body to be buried in a decent manner and by the side of my late companion of confinement, next my oldest son Harrison deceased, I give and bequeath to each of his three children viz, Samuel, Mary & Elizabeth Hudging the sum of fifty dollars apiece to be paid out of the sale of my property after paying my last debt if so much to be paid by my executors within twelve months after my decease, next I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Graham in addition to what I had before gave her which was one a negro girl named Pembroke & other property which she has been put in possession of, Now I further give her a negro boy by the name of William & ord further bid to be put in possession of by my Executors as soon as practicable after my decease, Next I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Doer the one half of the tract of land beginning on the East end with other personal property and perishable as I have here named viz one negro woman by the name of Dicy and her two children Liddy & Ned which she is in possession of, Also I leave my negro woman Hanny in the care and superintendence of my daughter Elizabeth as I wish her well treated and not to go out of the family, Also I give and bequeath in addition in perishable property if I have at my decease two cows and calves six head of sheep and ten head of hogs also two beds, furniture, one press, one chest, one large trunk, one table, one spinning wheel with the cupboard ware and kitchen furniture, Also I give grandson John Doer one bay horse, Next I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly Evans in addition to what she has been put in possession of which was one negro girl named Mariah and other property, one negro girl named Otter to be put in possession of after my decease

Next I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Doer in addition to what she has been put in possession of which was one negro boy by the name of Adam, a girl by the name of Liddy with other property four head of sheep which is her portion, Next I give and bequeath to my son Harrison Hudgings in addition to what I have paid and distributed to him here for the one half of the tract of land I was born on being the West side which he now has a living his sister Elizabeth Also give and bequeath to him my negro man Jack to be put in possession of after my decease and lastly I appoint James Doer and Robert Hudson my lawful executors and settling all former wills by me made, signed, made in the presence of me after annulling this codicil, I further give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Doer one cow now four years old past this the eighth day of July 1854
