Warrant from William Lenon to Robert B. Crackett

Known all men by these presents that we William Lenon of the County of Robertson & State of Tennessee and those whose names are below annexed are held and jointly bound with Robert B. Crackett of the County of Davidson and State of Tennessee in the final sum of three thousand dollars for the payment of which well and truly to be made and paid, ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, jointly and severally and firmly by these presents writing our hands and seals this 24th day of Oct. in the year eighteen hundred and thirty two.

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the said Robert B. Crackett hath purchased from the said William Lenon a certain tract or parcel of land containing two hundred and forty acres on Lyeacree Creek lying partly in Davidson and partly in Robertson County and State aforesaid bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at two white oaks on the south side of said Creek on West side of a bluff on meadow, south boundary line and runs West sixty four poles crossing said Lyeacree Creek in all one hundred and fifty five poles perpendicular said Lyeacree river continued in all one hundred and sixty seven poles to a creek and sawwood thence South with Parbys line one hundred and six poles to said Creek in all one hundred and twenty poles to a creek thence East one hundred and sixty seven poles to a creek thence North one hundred and twenty poles to the Beginning containing one hundred and twenty five acres, Also one tract beginning at the North boundary line of the above tract on a white oak standing on the bank of said Creek, thence running up said Creek with its meanders to a white oak on the bluff of said Creek thence West to William Lenon North West corner containing 7 1/2 acres, Also another tract Beginning on the North boundary line of the one hundred and twenty five and tract at a white oak standing on a bluff of said Creek running West seventy two poles to a creek and sawwood thence North eighty nine poles to a sugar tree thence South eighty nine poles to the Beginning containing forty acres. Crackett do well and truly pay off the above named notes when they severally fall due and the said William Lenon on such payments being made is bound to make unto the said Robert B.
