Term 1831 we have proceeded to value and divide the negroes belonging to the estate of Lampson Mordough Dec. amongst the legal heirs of the said Dec. Martha George Childs wife of the late Rebecca Mordough one of the heirs at law of Lampson Mordough Dec. and Martha A. Mordough her co-possessor in the following manner To wit we find the number of negroes to be valued and allotted as follows, to George Childs her co-possessor one negro boy Edmund valued at four hundred dollars, one boy Jack valued at four hundred dollars, girl Silvia valued and her two children Toby and Marcellus valued at five hundred and two dollars girl Mary valued at two hundred and fourteen dollars making the total sum of the six negroes fifteen hundred and twenty four dollars To Martha A. Mordough her co-possessor we have allotted and valued as follows one boy Nelson at four hundred and fifty dollars, girl Clemens at three hundred and twenty six dollars, girl Amy at two hundred and seventy five dollars, boy Willie at two hundred and seventy five dollars, girl Sarah at one hundred and fifty dollars making the total sum of fourteen hundred and seventy six dollars and that consequently the said Childs upon said division will pay to Martha A. Atkins deced boy Jim valued at \$175.00 Joseph G. Atkins deced boy Steve valued at \$125.00 Harriet A. Atkins deced girl Rachel valued at \$300. Mary Atkins deced boy Moses valued at \$235. Jackson Atkins deced girl Leticia valued at \$150. James Hamlet deced girl Edy valued at \$350. Isaac Atkins deced boy Ben valued at \$400. James P. Atkins deced boy Jerry valued at \$200. Margaret Hamlet deced boy Davy valued at \$235. Isabelle S. John Cross of Robertson County State of Tennessee do hereby make order and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking & cancelling all others. In the first place it is my will that all my just debts be paid, my stock of every sort such as my Eats (hereafter to be named) may think proper to be sold and such negroes as they may think it best to sell also the tract of land wherein I now live including the mill and distillery they may sell or rent as they think best for the interest of my family it is my wish that my family should live in Kentucky on my farm in Todd County called the Wilson tract but should my wife Eliza Cross prefer to live where and how she can do so and my Eats will sell at their discretion any land I may own in Tennessee or Kentucky the proceeds of the sales of all the property sold to go to the benefit of my children, it is my further wish that all the property retained and not sold by my Eats should be kept together and as my childrens marry or come to the age of maturity that they receive an equal proportion of it my wife reserving to herself her third part of the estate during her natural life then at her death to be divided equally between my children & their heirs, should either of my children die before they are of age or marry, then their portion to be divided equally among the survivors and I assign it upon my Executors to give my children a good liberal education, my wife Eliza Cross will have her choice of the negroes Lands &c. in the choosing the thirds after which my executors are authorized to sell any part of the negroes left & any of the lands in Tennessee or Kentucky that they may think best for the interest of my children, I hereby appoint my wife Eliza Cross, my Brothers George Cross and Thomas Cross my executors and executor to this my last will and Testament requesting the Courts of Tennessee and Kentucky to grant letters of Administration to my Eats above named authorizing them in security of any kind, In Testimony whereof I have hereunto attached my hand and affixed my seal this 31st day of May 1832
