We the undersigned being summoned by the Sheriff
of Smith County as a Jury to lay off the Dower of Nan-
cy Farmer late widow of Stephen Farmer Decd, and
also to set apart and allot to her a child's part of the ne-
groes belonging to the Estate of said Stephen, and after
being duly sworn by said Sheriff have laid off her

Dower in the following manner: To wit: Beginning on
the west side of Tobias's house near Reynard Farmers
then North thirty degrees, West one hundred and one
poles to Miller Sullivan's line, then East one hundred
and fifty one poles to a forked hickory on the North
side of the Mouth of the lane, then South twenty
Degrees, East one hundred and thirty poles to two ash
trees on the west side of the cleared Land, then
North thirty degrees west to the place of beginning, in-
cluding one hundred acres be the same more or less. &
including the mansion house & other out houses, where
the said Stephen Farmer usually dwelt last before
his Death with the appurtenances thereunto belonging.
We have also set apart and allotted to the said Nancy
Farmer a child's part of the Negroes belonging to the
Estate of the said Decedent, in the following man-
ner To wit: we have allotted to her a negro woman
by the name of Fillar about twenty five years of age
which said Negro Woman Fillar, according to our
calculations amounts to eighty two dollars & fifteen cents
over and above her distributive share of the Negroes
belonging to said Estate which she is entitled to, which
sum of eighty two Dollars and fifteen cents the
Nancy Farmer is to account for in the settlement of
her accounts with said Estate as Administrator.

9th My desire is that all my property of whatever kind which is not appropriated by the provisions of the foregoing Will be equally divided amongst my afore mentioned Legates -

10th I hereby nominate & appoint George Matlock Robert Allen Archibald M. Overton & Don Carlos Dixon as Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of October 1818
