Second I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Nancy an negro girl named Matilda and her increase, when she leaves the family and goes as part of her property to be valued at the time of her decease, my 2^d girl, and increase if any. Third I do leave that my property after the death of my beloved wife or intestancy be equally divided between my beloved children (to wit) Nancy, George, Cate, John, Sarah, Thomas, Maryann, Robert Thomas, Martha Lang, Dale, except my daughter Nancy's share, as above is bequeathed to her in her equal part - I say all of my property, not yet named to be equally divided among all my dear children.

Fourth I leave that my plantation and lands that I bought of Thomas Grant be held by my executor, and that he pay all just demands that may be against me, and I leave to my son George Given all my carpenters & joiners tools above his equal part as above stated, to be his own - Fifth I do make bequeath and appoint my whole and sole executor Adam Dale to this my last will and testament, hereby making all former wills by me made, in writing when I have been called at my hand and seal this 28th day of January in the year of our Lord 1822.
