In the name of God amen. I William Samwells of the County of Smith and State of Tennessee, being of sound and perfect mind and memory, do hereby bequeath to the said God, do this forth day of April in the year of our Lord and thousand eight hundred and nineteen make also publish this my last will and testament, in manner following, that is to say, first I give and bequeath to John Samwells, a certain negro boy by the name of Charles, namely I give and bequeath to my son Lipo Smith Samwells, a certain negro boy by the name of Lewis, I also give and bequeath to my named two sons, John Samwells and Lipo Smith Samwells, all and every part and parcel of this tract of land which I now live together with all the improvements and appurtenances thereto belonging, the same said tract of land to be equally divided between the two said sons, so as for each of them to have an equal part, in value, - I also give and bequeath to the said two sons, John and Lipo Smith Samwells, all my marking tools and my hand held furniture, such as Chisel, Plane, Table, Bedstead &c. I also give and bequeath, to my son John Samwells my Real Estate I also give and bequeath, to my two sons, John and Lipo Samwells, my Wagon and team, to be equally divided so as each and shall have an equal part in value. - Secondly I give and bequeath to my daughters, to wit, Sarah, Elizabeth, Mary, Polly, Rhoda and Susan, all the balance of my estate, be it real or personal, besides what I have above said, and bequeathed unto my two sons, as aforesaid, to be equally divided amongst them, also and finally, I give and bequeath to my late wife Rhoda Samwells, all and every part of my estate, both real and personal to her own proper use and behoof, so far as shall be necessary for her support & maintenance, for during her widowhood, but she the said Rhoda shall not sell, barter or convey any part or parcel of my estate, to any person or persons, whatsoever, without the consent of all the trustees, but after her death or widowhood all my estate both real and personal shall come and be conveyed to my two children, to wit, John and Lipo, and bequeathed to them, and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Anson Springfield and Lipo Smith (Sarah) Executors of this my last will and testament. For the name of God amen I William Belts, John
Cann, Isaac Sprague, and John of Sumner, being made in
body and of sound and perfect mind, and memory, commanding the
necessity of this voluntary ship, do make and publish this my
last will and testament in shew and form following, viz
I do give confer and bequeath unto William Belts and
his wife Helen, all the my real, personal and moveable
goods to his wife, to belong to them their heirs &c. forever, which
is given to them, as the full share of my estate.

I do give confirm and bequeath unto said son Oliver
and his wife Elizabeth Harriot, late the negroes Ben and
Jennet, also house given to his wife to belong to them
their heirs &c for ever, which is given to them as the free
share of my estate.

The Balance of my estate, I give bequeath and dispose of in the following manner, viz. to my wife Maria during her natural life and my five named Bets and one Bay named Sam, and their Vassals and Vassals are, Jacobus Bets and Jacobus and after her death to be equally divided amongst all my wife's children Mary Bets, Barbara Bets, Martha Washington Bets, Agnes Brode Bets, and William Nicholas Bets, and their heirs forever. — All the balance of my estate, I wish equally divided amongst my wife Martha and her children before mentioned as the law would do, provided I had not made this will except my son William Nicholas, who I bequeath seven hundred fifty dollars to be paid out of my estate for the purpose of educating him, is to be appropriated as being his share for his education. I as wife and bequeath unto Sam Robinson, and his wife Elizabeth Stewart, all the part of my estate coming from her great grandfather Jeremiah Stewart and his grand father John Stewart, to be collected by Sam C.
