The Condition of the above obligation is such That if the above bounden Elisha Jackson and William Brown Administrators of all and singular The goods and Chattels rights and Credits of Woodson Daniel deceased To make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods and Chattels rights and Credits of the deceased which shall or shall come into the hands knowledge or possession of the said Elisha Jackson and William Brown Or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made do exhibit or cause to be exhibited unto our ensuing County Court And the same goods and Chattels rights and Credits of the deceased at the time of his death which at any time hereafter comes into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him do well and truly administer according to Law and further do make or cause to be made a true and just account of the Administration within one year after the date of these presents and all the rest and various of the said goods Chattels and Credits which may be found remaining or on the said Administration account The same being first examined and allowed agreeably to Law shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respecting as the same shall be due pursuant to the true intent and meaning of this Administration and if it shall appear that any Will or Testament was made by the deceased And Executor or Executrix in their names do Exhibit the same unto Court inaking it allowed and approved of According if the said Elisha Jackson and William Brown thereunto be requested do render and deliver the said letters of Administration approbation of such Testament being first read and made in our said Court Then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force in Law
