Commissioners Report laying off all the lots in the several Districts

In conformity to an act of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee passed in Nashville on the Eleventh day of December Eighteen hundred and thirty four entitled an act to provide for the laying off of the several counties in this State into Districts of convenient size, within which districts of the people and Constables shall be elected and for other purposes together with a resolution appointing Commissioners for the several counties. His undersigned (to wit) Joseph James, Stephen Wallace, Hugh M. Miller, Henry L. Atkins and Ephraim Walker the Commissioners appointed for the County of Stewart, met at the office of the Circuit Court Clerk in the Town of Dover on Monday the Eighth day of February Eighteen hundred and thirty six and proceeded to lay off the County into Districts for the proposed Contingent of the people

to commence at the mouth of North Crook Creek running off said Creek with its meandering to the Seward Mount including Ashua Mount and all other all lands there along the Ridge dividing main Crook Creek from Dick's Fork of North Crook Creek continuing on the top of said Ridge until it meets the Montgomery County Line thence with the County line to Cumberland River thence down the River with its meandering to the beginning

Commencing at the mouth of North Crook Creek on the lower side of said Creek running thence down Cumberland River with its meandering to the mouth of Wolf Creek on the upper side thereof thence up Wolf Creek with its meandering to Ward's Road leading from Dover to Hopkinsville crossed the said the first time, thence with said Road in changing Meridith Creek thence to the forks of the Road near Thomas' Ferry, where the Red River from Works Road leaves the said thence with the Red River from Works Road to the Montgomery County line thence with the County line to the top of the dividing Ridge between North Crook Creek and Dick's Fork of North Crook Creek thence with the top of said Ridge pursuing the line of District No. 1 to the beginning
