

Last Will and Testament of
Jane Almaroad Dec
Prototated July + Aug June 1896

I Jane Almaroad do make and publish this my last will and testament thereby revoking and making void all others by me at any time made. First I direct that my funeral expenses be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money or any thing that I may have at my death. 2nd I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret E. Mullins and her heirs all of my personal property what ever I may have of all kind and all of my house hold furniture and all my kitchen furniture that I may have at my death.

3rd I give and bequeath to the said Margaret E. Mullins and her heirs my land the same that I live on all the land that I have and that I know her or owning the land of C. C. Smith, Celia Ingersoll, and Noah C. Cady, containing about thirty three Acres situated in the 7th Civil District of Sullivan County Tennessee which at the said Margaret E. Mullins and heirs is to have at my death.

4th I will and direct that if my son Simeon Almaroad would not live with the said Margaret E. Mullins and thus is to take care of the said Simeon Almaroad that he is to have the support of said family while he lives.

I witness whereof I do sign my last will and testament under my hand this the 3rd day of December 1889.

Smith one of the subscribing witnesses to said will on the 12th day of August 1896. and therefore paper writing was adjudged and decreed by the Court to be the last will and testament of the said Jane Almaroad, died and ordered to be recorded in the Book of Wills.
