Blessed be Almighty God for the same do make and establish this my last will and Testament. First I give and bequeath to my loving wife Minerva Bays all my house hold furniture and personal property, first b'w & seeds, Bed clothing, carpets, Truck, Cooking skins, wood or coal skins, pots or pans, Tea cups & saucers, Knives & Forks, Spoons, Plates and dishes, Farming Tools, Hors, forks, shovels, shorts, Tables, benches, chairs, Chest. One Buggy at W M Bays One Town lot in the town of Bristol fronting Broad Street on the south and bounded on the North by Mr. Erwin Bondurant. Lot containing one acre and one fifth to the same more or less to have & to hold as her property forever. Also on Town lot known as widow Dalton lot containing $\frac{1}{4}$ of an acre of land bounded by William Robinson lot formerly known as another Dalton lot. But more lately known J. E. Starnes. Also bequeath to Minerva Bays my loving wife one Red Milk Cow to be her property forever. I also bequeath to my wife Minerva Bays one lot of land formerly known as Col. English lot situated in Bristol N.C. also one known as widow Stone lot, also a lot or parcel of ground known

as Charles Stone lot containing $\frac{1}{4}$ acre to the same more or less adjoining widow Stone & Col. English lots forever.

I do nominate and appoint my wife Minerva Bays to be the sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament.
