Said tract of land is bounded by the lands of Martin Thomas & Jacob Thomas. A. M. Clellan & others.

Third I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret R. one dressing bureau, 1 set of silver Tea Spoons marked "S. R." and I also give & bequeath to John M. 1 set large silver spoons marked "R. R." & my silver watch & to William R. one set small silver spoons marked "R. R." 1 silver butter knife & silver soup ladle.

Fourth I give & bequeath the remainder of my estate both real and personal not heretofore mentioned & of which I may die possessed of to my three children equally.

Last I do hereby nominate & appoint Thomas Curtin my Executor & it is my desire & I do hereby nominate & appoint Robert P. Pickle as the guardian of my children.

And it is my desire & I do order & will that my said executor & guardian be not required to give bond or security in carrying out the provisions of my will. This Nov. 24 1883

I Eleanor Berry being of sound mind and disposing memory, and knowing that it is appointed for all living to die. After commending my soul to God and my body to be buried in a Christian manner, I dispose of my worldly effects in the following way to wit. I will and bequeath to my three sons - William A. John H. and James A. Berry. All the tract of land upon which they are all now living, to be equally divided between them, on condition that they pay to each of the other heirs one hundred and fifty dollars to be paid in two years from my decease.

Secondly, I will & bequeath to my daughter Susan L. Crumley, one cow and one hog. I also will that all my beds & bed clothes be divided among all my heirs by my daughter Susan L. Crumley and that she retain more than an equal share as a consideration for her kindness & attention to me in old age. I give to my son John H. Berry my Bible and Testament, in three volumes with notes by Rev. Mr. Edwards. The remainder of the books to be divided among my heirs. The balance of my property of all kinds to be sold at public sale and the proceeds to be used, to defray my funeral expenses and to pay all my indebtedness. The remainder if any to be equally divided to all my lawful heirs. And further I appoint my son John H. Berry, and John A. S. B. Byr my executors in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my seal the 18th day of July 1874.

Last will & Testament

Thomas Hall Dred

Probated August term 1888

I do make and publish
this as my last will and testament hereby revoking
and making void all other wills by me at any time
made.

First. I direct that my funeral expenses and all my
debts be paid as soon after my death as possible
out of any moneys that I may be possessed of, or
may first come into the hands of my Executors.

Secondly - I have given and sold August the 4th 1881

all my lands in the home farm to my boys - James
Hall - W. A. Hall Alexander Hall and Samuel
D. Hall. And since that date W. A. Hall has sold
his part of the land to Samuel D. Hall and Alexander
Hall and they Samuel D. Hall and Alexander D. Hall
are to pay back to the heirs the amount that W. A. Hall
was to pay. Alexander Hall is to pay the heirs three
hundred and fifty dollars. Samuel D. Hall is to pay
the heirs four hundred and fifty dollars, dollars, and
James Hall is to pay the heirs four hundred dollars.
The amount that Amos Hall was to pay is three hundred
and fifty dollars. As he has sold to Samuel Hall
and Alexander Hall they are to pay also the amount
of three hundred and fifty dollars, to the heirs, instead
of Amos Hall.

Thirdly - This boys Samuel D. Hall and Alexander Hall
James Hall. W. A. Hall I gave each of them four hundred
dollars in the home farm - and the rest of the heirs that
have not been paid four hundred dollars they must be made
equal with the rest of the heirs, and the balance of the
money be divided equally amongst the heirs.

Fourthly - I give and bequeath the Proffitt land that I
bought to my daughter Eliza Douglas and my daughter
Sarah Douglas, in land and notes and money I have
already given each of them four hundred dollars apiece
the balance of the heirs to wit: my daughter Emeline
Sprules has received two hundred dollars, and my
daughter Elizabeth Carroll has received two hundred
and sixty four dollars, and my son Jackson Hall
