Last will & Testament

of James T. Bond, Jr. Probated Jan'y term 1888

In the name of God Amen. I James Bond (Jr) of the County of Sullivan State of Missouri bring of sound and disposing mind and memory, calling to mind the frailty & uncertainity of human life, and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs, and to my worldly estate, and all the property, real personal or mixed, of which I hold in sight and possessed, or to which I shall be entitled at the time of my decease I devise, bequeath and dispose thereof in the manner following, to wit-

1st I give and bequeath to my wife Orgelia Ray and her children a tract of land owned by me in the State of Missouri, Shelby County, containing One hundred & twenty acres 120. and also one tract in the County of Sullivan State of Penn, containing sixty acres more or less, known as a part and parcel of the Spurgin or Crawford tracts on which Mr. Hawk now lives, joining the lands of J. R. Crawford, J. J. Harr and others, and one other tract containing Sixty seven 67 acres more or less, lying and being in the County of Sullivan State of Penn known as a part of the M. Bond died, Farm on which now lies John Brown adjoining the lands of Jacob Holt, J. M. Bond and others, all of my interest in the above described Farms I give and bequeath to my wife Orgelia Ray, also

2nd I give and bequeath to my niece Ida May Hicks, my present home tract of land containing sixty two acres more or less, adjoining the lands of Mrs. Bond, O. C. Doan and others, her and her children with all its pertinences thento

I further direct that the Farm that I bought of E.G. Bond, be sold by my Administrators and after my funeral expenses and debts are paid for the remainder to be equally divided between all my nieces & nephews, except my sister Orelia Ray.

I further direct that my Adm't sell all of my stock, Farm Implements, House hold and Belonging furniture, with all grains, nuts that belongs to me except, one team and yarning, 1 wagon, 1 long plow & double and single rons, one double shovel and such things as is necessary to make a crop with, a sufficient amount of grain and feed for horses and mvt and bread stuff for family use. I further direct that my Adm't pay to Nathan Hawk for his faithful services in my sickness fifty \$⁰⁰ dollars

I further direct that my Adm't after making sale of all my property divide the proceeds of my personalty equally between all my nieces & nephews except Orelia Ray.

Last will and Testament of Thomas Clark

I Thomas J. Clark being of sound mind & memory blessed by Almighty God for the same do make this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all other wills that I may have made. And first of all I will and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Cox and her two children J. B. Cox & Ellin Cox. The upper lot of land running or beginning at a black walnut & poplar corner to John Adurrell Jr. thence with a dividing line between John and Samuel Adurrell South forty eight poles to a stake thence with said line south fifty four east, one hundred and thirty poles crossing the creek to the beginning.

I also will and bequeath to my son John W. Clark Virginia & Charles M. Clark his two children the lower lot of land beginning at a red oak, the dividing line between the two brothers John & Samuel, then running back with that line to a stake, thence to a poplar & walnut on the ridge.

I also will and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Jane Cox four hundred dollars & out of that she is to have a young black horse valued at one hundred dollars.
