In the name of God Amen,
 I Samuel Bachman of Edgewood Sullivan County
 Tennessee, being of sound mind and memory, do hereby
 make, publish and declare this to be my last will and
 Testament, hereby making and making void all former
 wills by me at any time heretofore made.
 I order and direct my Executors as soon after my death
 as practicable, to pay off and discharge all the debts due
 and liabilities that I may exist against me at the time
 of my death. I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah
 Bachman an ample life time support off of my home-
 stead farm during her natural life or widowhood.
 I also give and bequeath to my wife Sarah Bachman
 all of my notes, bonds and personal property, except what
 I bequeath and specify to my children namely; William
 Bruce Bachman and Lavinia Elizabeth Bachman, now
 Martin. I give and bequeath to my son William Bruce

Bachman the note or bond which I hold against David
 Kitzmiller. I also give and bequeath to my son William Bruce
 Bachman the note or bond which I hold against Henry
 A. Martin, except \$5000 (Fifty dollars). I also give and
 bequeath to my son William Bruce Bachman, 1 Bay mare
 also. And now if the David Kitzmiller note or bond
 above mentioned, all or any part of it should prove not
 collectable, my daughter Lavinia Elizabeth Martin is
 to pay pro to my son William Bruce Bachman one
 half of the uncollected part of the said David Kitzmiller
 note above mentioned.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Lavinia Elizabeth
 Martin, the home stead farm, except my wife Sarah
 Bachman's support which she holds on said farm
 during her natural life or widowhood. I also give
 and bequeath to my daughter Lavinia Elizabeth Martin
 the notes or bonds which I hold on H. A. Martin.
 I also give and bequeath to my daughter Lavinia
 Elizabeth Martin, 1 Bay mare farm.

I hereby nominate and appoint William Bruce
 Bachman and Henry A. Martin as Executors.
