I will & direct that my executors hereinafter named shall sell at public sale all my real & personal estate as soon after my death as they think best & on such credit as they may prefer & after collecting the same pay it out as directed in this my will.

And in order that my executors may carry out the provisions of my will I hereby vest them with full power & authority to sell my Real estate & to make titles to the same with general warranty as fully as I could if living.

I am indebted to King College by subscription in the sum of one thousand dollars. I direct my executors to pay this debt if the same is not paid by me in my life time.

I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my nephews J. P. Thomas & J. P. King executors of this my Last Will and Testament & request the County Court not to require a Bond of them as my executors. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my name this 29 day of Apr. 1884

of
Mary Buckellor Deed,

In the name of God amen.
& Mary Buckellor being of sound mind but
fable body do hereby make this my last will &
testament & in doing so I do hereby revoke all other
wills heretofore made by me viz. First I will my
soul to God who gave it. 2d that my burial expenses
& just debts be paid out of my estate & also that
a sufficient amount of same be appropriated to
putting tomb stones to my grave and also to the
grave of my sister Rachael Beard if said grave
is without tomb stones.

After these items if there is money enough to be
obtained out of my estate. The black woman I
named Dorcas Nillard is to have sixty dollars
(60\$) to pay for a lease for her & George Buckellor
is to have one hundred dollars 100\$ The Rev. Jas.
B. Converse is to have ten dollars (10\$) the Pastor
of the M.E. church south at Bloomville at the
time of my death is to have ten dollars (10\$)
Also the Lutheran Dunkard & Christian churches
each 10\$. But if at my death the amount of
means or money on hand (or if which I am
possessed) is not sufficient for each of these
persons & churches named. to have the amount
specified the amount of said means or money
shall be pro rated among them out of my
effects provided that this shall not be so
construed as to interfere with or prevent the
distribution of individual articles according to
particular bequests herein after mentioned.
I further will that the balance of money if any
after the above mentioned items shall be equally
divided between the Baptist church at Bloomville
& the Baptist foreign missionary society & the
Baptist tract society for the distribution of books
to the poor. I further will that J. G. Radin keep the
fifty dollars he owes me and that C. M. Radin keep
the thirty-one dollars due me from him on my
father's estate and that J. P. Radin & his father

E. D. Rader have the hundred dollar note & hold on him. I further will that Dorcas Willard (colored) is to have my bed, bedstead & bed-clothes also my safe & my under clothing, chemise, stockings, all my coarse clothing & shirts, & wollen shawl, and also all the was be longing to the safe & my saddle & a wollen cover lid. I will my Bureau to Mr. Rader at the old strong place, my Bible to Eveline Rader with the special request that she take good care of it, as it will be for or against her in the day of judgment. The balance of my books may be divided among my relations. It is my will that Mary Cot wife of Sam'l. E. Cot be to the distribution of my clothing as herein provided. I further will my needle worked counterpanes to Mrs. Mary Carmack wife of Robert Carmack, & that my niece Mrs. Mary Aikens nee Mary Vaughan have my black silk shawl. I hereby appoint Dr. H. T. Bulkeley as my executor & ask the court to act upon this appointment. Given under my hand this 8th of June 1881.

I Adam S. Barnes do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made.

1st First I direct that my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of the personal property I may leave at my death.

2nd Secondly I will that my son James Barnes be paid ninety (90) dollars out of the personal property I may leave at my death having already advanced to him I think a sufficiency to make one thousand dollars with this ninety.

3rd I will that my son George E. Barnes be paid sixty one (61) dollars out of the personal property I may leave at my death having already advanced to him a sufficiency I think to make one thousand dollars with this sixty one.

4th Fourthly I will that my son Frank E. Barnes pay back to my estate at my death the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars having already advanced to him a sufficiency to make one thousand dollars after he pays back the two hundred and fifty dollars.

5th Fifthly I will that my son A. T. Barnes have all the land I own on the south side of a line commencing at T. J. Mullis and A. S. Barnes white oak corner near the calf skin lick then running a little south of each so as to leave the Bob Clark house on the north side hence running straight to a planted rock near where the old little Peace School house stood A. S. Barnes & Frank Lewis corner I think the land is worth five hundred and fifty dollars and this together with what I have already advanced to him I think will make about one thousand dollars. But if it is A. T. Barnes should
