And in order that my Executors may carry out the provisions of my will I hereby wish them with full power & authority to sell my Real estate & to make titles to the same with general warranty as fully as I could if living.

I am indebted to King College by subscription in the sum of one thousand dollars & direct my Executors to pay this debt if the same is not paid by me in my life time.

I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my nephews J. D. Thomas & J. P. King Executors of this my Last Will and Testament & request the County Court not to require a Bond of them as my Executors.

Mary Buckellor Deed.

In the name of God Amen.

I Mary Buckellor being of sound mind but feeble body do hereby make this my last Will & Testament & in doing so I do hereby revoke all other wills heretofore made by me viz. First I will my soul to God who gave it. 2<sup>nd</sup> That my burial expenses & just debts be paid out of my estate & also that a sufficient amount of same be appropriated to putting tomb stones to my grave and also to the grave of my sister Rachel Beard if said grave is without tomb stones.

After these items if there is money enough to be obtained out of my estate. The black woman I raised Dorcas Willard is to have sixty dollars (60\$) to pay for a house for her & George Buckellor is to have one hundred dollars (100\$) The Rev. Jas. B. Converse is to have ten dollars (10\$) the Pastor of the M.E. church south at Blountville at the time of my death is to have ten dollars (10\$) Also the Lutheran Dunkard & Christian churches each 10\$. But if at my death the amount of means or money on hand (or if which I am possessed) is not sufficient for each of these persons & churches named. to have the amount specified the amount of said means or money shall be pro-rated among them out of my effects provided that this shall not be so construed as to interfere with or prevent the distribution of individual articles according to particular bequests hereinafter mentioned.

I further will that the balance of money if any after the above mentioned items shall be equally divided between the Baptist church at Blountville & the Baptist foreign missionary society & the Baptist tract society for the distribution of books to the poor. I further will that J. J. Raden keep the fifty dollars he owes me and that C. M. Raden keep the thirty-six dollars bal. due me from him on my father's estate and that J. P. Raden & his partner

E. D. Raden have the hundred dollar note & hold on them. I further will that Dorcas Willard (colored) is to have my bed, bedstead & bed-clothes also my safe & my under clothing, chemise, stockings, all my coarse clothing & shirts, & wollen shawl, and also all the ware belonging to the safe & my saddle & a wollen cover bed. I will my Bureau to Mr. Raden at the old nursing place, my Bible to Caroline Raden with the special request that she take good care of it, as it will be for or against her in the day of judgment. The balance of my books may be divided among my relations. It is my will that Mary Cot wife of Saml. E. Cot see to the distribution of my clothing as herein provided. I further will my needle worked counterpane to Mrs. Mary Carmack wife of Robert Carmack & that my niece Mrs. Mary Aiken nee Mary Vaughan have my black silk shawl. I hereby appoint Dr. H. P. Dulaney as my executor & ask the court to ask upon this appointment. Given under my hand this 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1881.

5 Fifthly I will that my son A. P. Barnes have all the land I own on the south side of a line commencing at T. J. Murrello and A. S. Barnes white oak corner near the calf skin lick then running a little south of east so as to leave the Bob Clark house on the north side thence running straight to a planted rock near where the old Clark School house stood A. S. Barnes & Frank Kemps corner I think said land is worth five hundred and fifty dollars and this together with what I have already advanced to him I think will make about one thousand dollars.
