

Last Will and "Testament," & Protested July Term 1896

G. A. Caldwell Decd" { I, George A. Caldwell
of Bristol, Tennessee

make this my last will and testament.

After my death I desire that my executor shall pay all expenses incident to my funeral and any debts I may owe, and he shall be at liberty to dispose of any property of which I die seized and possessed, of all my property both real and personal, and that ~~at public~~ or private sale to obtain money sufficient to pay said expenses and debts.

In the event she is alive at my death, I desire that my beloved wife, Margaret E. Caldwell, shall during her natural life have the use and possession of all my property both real and personal, and that she shall with the consent of my executor, have the right to dispose of any of said property so as to provide subsistence and fifty (\$7000) dollars per year as a support for herself and any of my unmarried daughters remaining at home with her.

At the death of my wife, I desire that all my estate, both real and personal, shall be equally divided between my children to-wit: Joseph A. Caldwell, Maggie A. McFarland, John H. Caldwell, Ada R. Caldwell, Maud, S. Hager, Estelle Caldwell, Clifford D. Caldwell and George A. Caldwell, or their heirs.

I desire that my son John H. Caldwell shall act as my executor and that he shall not be required to execute any bond.
