

Following Viz. Mr. Slaughter, Cal. on now, about fifteen dollars (\$15.) W.P. McCullum, acc't. about \$20, Tomalty dollars Amos R. Moulton a small amount. Dr. Geo. R. Duncan for waiting on me and my funeral & burial expenses - be paid in manner as herein after directed.

Second. In consideration for the affection & care that I have for my nephew William Murrell Jr. Son of my brother Harry Murrell, and the further consideration that he pay all of my debts as above named as soon after my decease as possible and also pay to J.H. Davis the balance I own on my lands amounting to about \$300⁰⁰, Three hundred and fifty dollars, and further that he pay to my Brother Harry & Jim Murrell and my Sister Phoeby Lynn, each five dollars (\$5.00) in one year from my death.

Now for all of the aforesaid considerations. I will and bequeath to my said nephew William Murrell Jr. all my real and personal property that I may die seized & possessed of consisting of Horses, Cows, hogs, wheat, corn, oats, wagons, Gravel, Farming tools & house hold, kitchen furniture & a tract of land lying in the 15th Civil Dist. of Sullivan Co. Pa., and bounded by Amos Wills, Eldridge Bachman & others, containing about eighty acres more or less. etc. being the same tract on which I now reside.

Third. I will and bequeath to my brothers Jim & Harry Murrell & my Sister Phoeby Lynn \$100 dollars each to be paid to them as above stated.

Fourth. I hereby nominate and appoint W.P. McCullum my Executor of this my last will & Testament.

First. I command my spirit unto God who gave it, and hope for a blessed inheritance when this mortal coil shall have ceased. Secondly - I give, bequeath and devise to my Sister Mary Ellen Childress, all my real and personal and mixed property of every description that I may own and possess at my death, during her life - and

Third - It is my will and I so devise this as and after the death of my said sister Mary Ellen, all my interest in the home place where we now reside in Kristo, and all my interest in any and all farm lots, vacant and improved inside or outside the corporate limits of Kristo shall go to my three brothers, J. C. Barnes, O.K. Barnes and F. Barnes equally.

Fourth - After the death of my said sister Mary E. I will and devise all my one half interest in and to a tract of land of twenty six acres, purchased by myself and said Sister of J.H. Caldwell on the 13th day Jan'y 1886, being a portion of the old W.P. farm of farm on Bear Creek south west of Kristo in said County and also four fifths (4/5) of my undivided half interest in a tract of eighty nine acres of land purchased by myself and said Sister on the 1st day of 1885 of W.P. Kearn in Bear Creek in said County, and being a part of the W.P. Kearn tract of land. I will and devise to my said brothers J.C. Barnes and O.K. Barnes after the death of my said Sister - Mary E.

Fifth - I will and devise to my nephew Samuel Hester Chilدرس one fifth $\frac{1}{5}$ of my undivided half interest in the said tract of eighty nine acres of land purchased of W.P. Kearn 5 Aug 1881 situated on Bear Creek in Said County, and the same tract in which I will J.J. Chilدرس and O.P. Chilدرس further above to take effect after the death of the said Mary Ellen Chilدرس, as it is my desire that said sister shall have the use and benefit of all my property during her life and after her death, then to go as above indicated.
