

Annunciation Will

Margaret E. Coube died

Probated in Law Court
at New York at its
March Term 1898

On the 17th day of August, 1897, Margaret E. Coube (widow) in her last sickness, at her own habitation, in Sullivan County, Tenn. declared in the presence of the undersigned persons (J. G. Coube, M. E. King, and C. Coube) the former of whom she especially requested to bear witness thereto, that her will concerning her property was as follows:

(1) That Daisy (her daughter) was to have all that was in the parlor and all that was in the up-stair room over the sitting room.

(2) That King (her son) was to have all that was in the sitting room and all the horse except what it would take to make meat.

(3) That Daisy and King were to divide the bed-quits equally between them and were to have all the mornys except that she wanted Hattie (her daughter) Hattie's wife of I & Stone to have one pair.

(4) That she wanted all of her things to go just as she had told them all. (This was referring to former statements made to members of the family.) That she did not want anything taken from the house, that she did not want her things taken up and a sale made.

The said Margaret E. Coube died on August 18th 1897.

This instrument, setting forth the will of the testatrix, has been reduced to writing by an attorney at law, at our request and by our direction.

This will was certified by the Clerk of this Court to the Law Court at Bristol, Tennessee, to be tried upon an issue of "devise and bequest" and the same was adjudged by a jury of twelve good and lawful citizens of Sullivan County, to be a valid testamentary will and the judgment of the Court ordered to be certified back to this Court and signed upon the minutes of the Court, and the will to be recorded in the Book of Wills as the valid testamentary will of Margaret E. Coube deceased, which was accordingly done. (See minute Book page 294)
