Cross, being in feeble health, but of sound mind and disposing memory, and being desirous of making such a disposition of my property as I deem just and equitable among my children, do hereby make and publish this as my last will and testament, hereby revoking all wills heretofore made by me.

First - It is my will and desire that my personal property, consisting of household and kitchen furniture be disposed of as follows, to wit: My daughter, Martha, is to have my clock & 2 chairs, my daughter, Susan is to have my cast-iron stove, my son William is to have my bed & 2 chairs, and my daughter Lydia is to have my fall-leaf table and my two chairs - this being the only personal property owned by me.

railroad and citizen of Sullivan
County Tennessee, of body from nature and
sound mind, but of weak and disposing mind
and memory, and realizing the uncertainty of this
life and the positive certainty that under any
circumstances its close cannot be far in the fu-
ture, do make, ordain, publish and declare this to be
my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former
wills by me, at any time made or executed.
Having implicit confidence in the being and ex-
istence of God and trusting in His goodness and
mercy I commend my soul to Him, and bowing
submissively to His will, invoke His continual
blessings upon those of my friends who may
survive me in life.
First I dispose of my Estate in the following manner
I desire that my burial expenses, and any other
just debts that I may owe at the time of my
death be paid by my Executor to be taken in after
manner, as soon after my death as may be
convenient to him out of funds that may
come in to his hands as my executor.

Second I will give and bequeath to my niece Alice B.
Sell, daughter of Joseph & Margaret Sell the
sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000) the same to
be invested in land for her sole and separate
use, separate and apart from any husband she
may hereafter have, the same to belong to her
during her natural life, and to go her heirs op-
ten I have by appoint W. D. Dungan, a citizen of
Elizabethton Tennessee, trustee for my said niece
Alice B. Sell, he to have charge of the \$2000
sum bequeathed to her until such time as he &

she shall agree to invest the same in land, while said
sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000) remain in the
hands of said trustee, it is my desire that he pay
the interest thereon to the said Alice B. Sell
annually, or as she may need same. If it
should be deemed advisable to sell the land or any
part thereof, purchased for my said niece the
same may be done by him with the consent of the
trustee, the to join with her in the conveyance,
and all moneys arising from such sale to be
invested in lands by said trustee subject to
like restrictions & conditions as before.
Third After the payment of the bequest hereinafore
made I will give and devise to my beloved wife
Bertha J. Longmire, the entire residue of my
estate, real, personal & mixed and with all
further accumulation, all the property of which
I may die seized.

Fourth I nominate, constitute & appoint my Brother in law,
W. D. Dungan, Executor of this my last Will and
Testament, and as trustee of my said estate
and request that none be appointed having full
confidence in his honesty integrity and ability
exercise him from giving bond both as Executor
of my last Will and Testament and as trustee
of my said Alice B. Sell and request that none
be appointed of him, upon this qualification
as said Executor and trustee.
