John H. Casley Decd. Probated April term 1887

I John H. Casley do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may be possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executors.

Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my three sons John H. - Edmund P. - and Hiram V. Casley my home tract of land on which I now live and all the appurtenances therunto belonging

containing 114 acres more or less situated in the 13th district of Sullivan County Tennessee and also all my farming implements that I have any interest in, also my Blacksmith tools also one Buggy and harness and wagons, and also all of my notes and accounts and all money that is or may be on hand, also three clocks and all my interest in the bees, also one rifle Gun Third, I give and bequeath unto my other four

Children Albert N. Casley, Mary E. Dolan Matilda Ann Casley and Sallie F. Casley, to wit, I give to Albert N. Casley seventy five dollars, and give to Mary E. Dolan seventy five dollars, to my daughter Matilda Ann Casley two hundred and fifty dollars and to my daughter Sallie F. Casley two hundred and fifty dollars

Fourth, I further will that my three sons John H. - Edmund P. - and Hiram V. Casley pay over to my other four children Albert N. Casley, Mary E. Dolan, Matilda Ann Casley and Sallie F. Casley the full amount above stated

Fifth, I further will that Mary A. Casley my wife is to have her support and anything that would be necessary to make her comfortable during her natural life.

Sixth, I further will that my two daughters Matilda Ann and Sallie F. Casley is to have their support out of the proceeds of the farm so long as they remain as one of the family or single

Seventh, I will to Mary A. Casley my wife John H. Casley, Edmund P. Casley, Hiram V. Casley Matilda Ann Casley and Sallie F. Casley all of my interest that I have in the house hold and kitchen furniture

Eighth, I request that my three sons John H. - Edmund P. - and Hiram V. Casley pay over to my two daughters Matilda Ann and Sallie F. Casley fifty dollars in each one of their interests in six months, and in twelve months one hundred dollars each and the remainder of their interests in twelve months without interest and also to pay

Last will & Testament ~ Probated July term
George R. Cowan Dec 1887

Sullivan County Tenn.
March 14th 1887

I George R. Cowan being of sound mind
and disposing memory do make and
publish this my last will and testament
in manner and form as follows.

First, I will and direct that my funeral
expenses and all of my just debts be fully
paid out of the first monies that may come
into the hands of my Executors herein after
mentioned.

Secondly, I will and bequeath unto my daughter
Pauce Collins in addition to the property that
I have already her and the land that I have
deeded to her two hundred dollars to be paid
her by my Executors within two years after
my death.

Thirdly, I will and bequeath unto my wife
Alice F. L. Cowan all of my household and
kitchen furniture my gray horse, Brown mare
two young mares and three milk cows and
the Jersey wagon and all of the farming
implements that she may desire to keep and
all of the grain and provisions on hand at
my death.

Fourthly, I will bequeath unto my four sons
John R. Cowan J. B. Cowan Geo. M. Cowan &
C. M. Cowan all of my real estate to be equally
divided between them according to valuation
requiring each of said sons to pay to my youngest
daughter S. M. Cowan three hundred dollars when
she arrives at the age of eighteen years.
I further will and direct that my wife Alice
F. L. Cowan hold full control and possession of
my house and farm until my youngest son
C. M. Cowan arrives at the age of twenty one
years of age whilst she is still my widow, and
after the said sons shall have divided and
taken possession of said farm then I direct that my
wife Alice F. L. Cowan still have her support and
home so long as she remains my widow.

Fifthly, I direct that after advertising thirty days my
Executors sell all stock and other effects not
herein disposed of in twelve months time and
after fully settling all debts and expenses of
my estate the remaining monies if any be
appropriated to the education of my children
But if not consumed in this way then to be
equally divided between the six children herein
named. Lastly I nominate and appoint M. S. Cowan
and W. P. Delaney Executors of this my last will and
testament.
