publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking
and annulling all former wills by me at any time heretofore
made and first

I command my soul to God who gave it and that my body
be interred by my beloved husband in Barnes graveyard
and to be such world estate as I hath pleased God to en-
trust me with I dispose of the same as follows to wit

First it is my will that all my just debt and funeral expenses
be paid as soon after my decease as possible out of any money
that I may die possessed of Secondly I give and bequeath
unto Jonathan Morrell who is now living with me one tract
of land known as the Samuel Crawford tract containing fifteen
acres adjoining the land that I inherit from and all my house
hold and kitchen furniture and all the stock that I have and
all the goods of hand that I have almy stock

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Jonathan Morrell
my executors in witness whereof I do to this my will setting
my hand and seal this the 27th day of March 1870

John Suckar Deed 1. September 1881

I John Suckar make this my last will and testament and
by revoking all other wills made by me on this the 23rd
day of August 1879 and appoint John S. Hammon to write
in my last will which I shall hereafter give in particular
the reasons wherefore I desire to distribute my personal and
real estate among my several heirs consisting of two se-
veral families being the child-sun of my two wives formerly and
during their living three child-sun of my first wife known
as the child-sun of my second wife known
