

ing. They are to pay to my son Perry P. Fish five dollars; and twenty five dollars to J. B. Hilliard and Co. and Dr. R. L. Kitzmiller for debts he (Perry P. Fish) owes them; to be paid to him in proportion to their debts; this is one hundred dollars which I regard as being paid to the said Perry P. Fish, and to the heirs of my daughter Sarah (Julia Ann Keating, Noah Keating and Silas Keating) each (#33.33 1/3 ct.) thirty three and one third dollars; and to my daughter Mary Jane Rattliff one hundred dollars (she has married since the above named will was made). The one hundred dollars to be paid to Perry P. Fish and his creditors in two years from my decease, that to the heirs of Sarah in three years, and that to Mary Jane in four years. The above debts to constitute a lien; each one hundred dollars a lien on one fifth of the 87 1/2 acres, but no one debt shall take more than one fifth. The two holding the land shall each pay one half of the above debts. Lastly it is my desire that this Codicil be attached to, and constitute a part of my will to all intents and purposes this the 17 day of November 1886

Secondly To Mr. H. H. Gaines my son my husbands portrait, the old side board, three foot ladder, & crow bar & chest.

Thirdly, To my son Edmund D. Gaines I will the Bureau & wash stand.

Fourthly, To my daughter Anna J. Rayel I will the cupboard in dining room and Aunt Gallies Fall leaf table.

Fifthly, To my daughter Susan Neal, my bed & bed clothes except corn fork.

Sixthly, To my beloved daughter Elizabeth Lynn Mary's feather bed.

Seventhly, To Drs. Delaney & Miller ballance of my library for medical services.

Eighthly, To my son Samuel M. Gaines my fathers portrait.

Ninthly, To John Scarborough his own portrait & the portrait of his father & mother.

In the second place as to my real estate after considering well the situation, I give and bequeath to my daughter in law (for past favors and kindnesses shown me in my

helpless & decrepit old age) Harriette G. Gaines
the wife of my beloved son Franklin Gaines
all of the old household tract situated in
the State of Tennessee Sullivan County, and
in Civil District No. 10 bounded as follows
to wit, on the North by Reddy Creek a line of
the old Roller track, on the East by Anderson
Lyons & Foush; on the South by Foush & Shaver
on the West by Lantier, Luttrell & Gaines; To have
and to hold the same and every part thereof
to her own separate use benefit & behoof in
fee simple, free from the marital rights of her
husband or the claims and demands of
his creditors.

Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint
my son Franklin Gaines my executor. In
witness whereof I do, to this my will, set
my hand and seal. This 3rd day of April 1885.

Last Will & Testament of Samuel Bachman Dec'd

Samuel Bachman, Dec'd

I Samuel Bachman of the County of Sullivan and
State of Tennessee being of sound mind and disposing memory
do hereby make and publish this as my last Will and Testament.
hereby revoking and making void all other Wills and instru-
ments of writings made by me at any other time;

First: I give and bequeath to my son William M. Bachman
all the farm on which I now live including all the lands
lying on the North and South sides of Horse Creek with the
exception of a small corner of Wood land adjoining the
Childres farm (or the farm I lately bought of the said
John Childres) this land that is to be cut off of my home farm
and attached to the Childres farm is to be run off thus-
Beginning at the ash and Rock corner at or near the foot
of the hill & near on at the Mouth of the lane - thence
running with the fence with all of its meanders to the top of the
hill next or nearest to the Woodland or the old Benet field
thence a straight line from said corner of the fence to
the Woods line on the old Benet field to have and to hold
the same during his natural life. With remainder over
to the heirs of his body forever and I further bequeath to my
son W^m M^r Bachman one half of all the Horses and Mules
that may be on the farm at my Death that is to say after
my three Daughters yet to be provided for gets theirs - and
further one half of all the farming tools of every kind
including Machinery &c - and one half of all the harned
cattle one half of the hogs and one half of the sheep
all to be equally divided in value between W^m M^r Bach-
man - & James Thomas Bachman - and I further be-
queath to son W^m M. Bachman one bed with bed clothes
sufficient for winter and three good chairs.

Second

I give and bequeath to my son James Thomas Bachman
all the land I lately bought of John C. Childres known
as the Childres farm together with a small lot of
Wood land cut off of the home farm - as described by
the line beginning at the ash and rock corner and running
with the meanders of the fence to the top of the hill on corner
of the fence nearest the Woods line - all the above described
