

Last Will & Testament
of
S. C. M. Hudgins Decd. Probated at
December Term
1883

In the name of said Amen!
I S. C. M. Hudgins of the Town of Woodson Wash-
ington County Virginia do make and publish
this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking
all other wills or Codicils heretofore made by
me, that is to say:

First. I direct that all my just debts be paid as
soon after my death as possible, so as not to do
detriment to my estate.

Second. I will and bequeath to my mother Bettie H.
Hudgins all of my estate, both real and personal after
my just debts are paid, during her life, for her support
and maintenance, to be free and clear of and from
any and all manner of encumbrances and incumbrances
of her present husband, or any husband she may
hereafter take, except that I will and direct that my
father shall be allowed to live at home with mother and
enjoy my property to that extent only, but is to have
no interest or control in or over it, and with the fair
understanding that he is only to have a home.

Third. At the death of my mother I will and bequeath
my property both real and personal, there may
be on hand not consumed in my mother's support to
my two sisters Kessie and J. Alice Hudgins provided
they are single. If either one of them is married then
the whole of the property is to go to the one that is unmarried
and if either or both are widowed then they or she is to
have the same as if they had never been married.

Fourth. In the event my father survives my mother
I further will and direct that he is still to have a
home with the girls during his life.

Fifth. In the event my mother survives the two sisters
heretofore named then I will and bequeath that my
property be equally divided among all my brothers
and sisters then living or their children.

Sixth. I further will and direct that my nephew
Herman Hudgins be allowed to have a home with my
mother or sisters until he arrives at the age when

he is able to work for a living - and here express the desire
that he be sent to the free schools and put to some honorable
trade or profession.

Seventh. I hereby constitute and nominate my said mother
Bettie H. Hudgins the executrix of this my last will and
testament and direct that she be not required to give
Bond as said executrix.

In the 1st year of our Lord 1884
I know all men by these presents that I Robert
Hawth being in a full, sound mind and a firm belief
in the Lord Jesus Christ assuming that
my day on earth are few do hereby will
and bequeath all my property both real and
personal as follows

To my eldest son studious seventy five acres
of land to be cut off to him on the 1st of Jan
and the farm at the option of my wife Sarah
and my son James the rest of the farm to my
wife Sarah until her death then to my son James
To my daughter Annie one thousand Dollars
when she is twenty one years old to be paid
by my two sons jointly

To my wife I bequeath all my personal property
except one gleaming pail which is to belong to
my daughter Annie and to raised on the farm

until able for service. All my business to be settled
and debts to be paid by my two sons out of my personal
property. James is to take of wife as long as she lives
and my daughter Annie until she marries. To my
nephew Leo Peoples a horse and saddle when he is
twenty one years old to be bought and paid for by
my sons. All my household and kitchen furniture
I leave to the option of my wife. This being my last
Will and Testament I do hereby set my hand affixing
