The last will & Testament of Henry Hughes dec'd

State of Tennessee In the name of God Amen
Sullivan County, I Henry Hughes knowing that it

is appointed unto all men once to
die and after death the judgment and being weak in
body, but sound in mind and memory, thanks be to God,
do make and publish this my last will and testament
hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me
First I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body
to its mother earth

Second I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts
shall be fully paid out of my estate, first

Third I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Deborah
Hughes all my personal property except what is here-
inafter otherwise disposed of for her use and that of

my six children until my youngest child, Charles Henry Hughes, shall come to the age of twenty one years, then all the personal property on hand shall be divided equally or sold and the proceeds of said sale equally divided between my dear wife and six children viz: Robert Hughes, Alice Hughes, Joseph Hughes, August Dock Hughes, Ella Hughes and Charles Henry Hughes. I further will and direct that my wife shall have full power and authority at any time she may find it necessary to sell any personal property on hand such as stock of any kind and grain or any other species of personal property for the purpose of meeting and paying the expenses of supporting and educating my children. I further will and direct that my dear wife shall have full power and authority to take and appropriate so much of the proceeds of my farm, such as grain of every kind, Hay, oats, fodder and all kinds of provisions, as will be amply sufficient to supply her wants and that of my children and the residue if any shall be sold by my Executor hereinafter named, and the proceeds of such sale put at interest for the benefit of my children equally till the youngest child, Charles Henry Hughes shall arrive at the age of twenty one years then to be equally divided between my wife Deborah Hughes and my six children hereinafter named. I further will and direct that all monies on hand at my death and all debts due me shall be taken charge of by my Executor and my debts collected by him and all placed at as high interest as can be obtained from safe parties. It is further my will and direction that should the proceeds of my farm and the stock of any kind that my wife Deborah Hughes may sell be not sufficient to meet her wants and that of my six children then it is my will and direction that she apply to my executor for as much of the monies on hand or at interest as will be amply sufficient to meet her wants and that of my six children. Which monies he shall furnish her taking her receipt for the same.

which receipt shall be a perpetual bar to the recovery of said monies off of him by any other person. Said monies to be divided equally between my beloved wife and six children when my youngest child Charles Henry Hughes arrives at full age, I further will and bequeath to my son Robert Hughes one black two year old mare. I further will and direct that my four two year old mules be sold by my Executor either privately or publicly and the proceeds put at interest with my other monies as herein provided. And my real estate I dispose of in the following manner - I will and direct that my dear wife shall have the free use and control of all my lands for her use and benefit and that of my children until my youngest child, Charles Henry Hughes shall arrive at the age of twenty one years, then I will and direct that all my lands be sold by my Executor either at public or private sale as he may deem best upon such terms as will be most to the interest of my heirs and the proceeds of said sale I direct shall be equally divided between my wife Deborah Hughes and my six children herein named. I further will and direct that if in the judgment of my family, Executor and friends if they think at any time it would be best to sell my real estate and personal property and reinvest in other real estate I will and direct that my Executor dispose of my real estate and personal property on the best terms that can be obtained either privately or publicly as he may deem best and make a title to the purchaser for the same. I further will and direct that the money when reinvested in real estate that the title to said purchased real estate be noted in my beloved wife and six children and shall be controlled as hereinbefore mentioned. Lastly I appoint my beloved brother Samuel D. Hughes my Executor to this my last will and testament and further will and direct that he shall not be required to execute his bond to the County Court or State of Tennessee but shall execute his bond to the heirs hereinafter mentioned for all monies as they come into his hands and shall receipt for all notes that come

into his hands and she when he presents his bond for money collected on said note his receipt to be returned to him.

Second I will & bequeath to my son Benjamin S. Shipley the farm on which I live containing one hundred and twenty nine acres more or less upon the following condition, that is that my wife and the rest of her at home are to stay on said farm and as far as they are able help to support the family, my wife to have full control of the house in which I live & what pertains to the same, that my son Benjamin S. Shipley is to see that my two afflicted children, one which is deaf and dumb whose name is Mary A. Shipley, and the other which is an idiot whose name is Reuben Shipley are properly cared for as much as their condition will allow. I also will that my son Benjamin S. Shipley keep the property all together and that none of it be squandered or foolishly disposed of but kept for the use of the family, and that should he not carry out my requests he shall forfeit all interest

Thirdly I will that my son Albert P. Shipley have twenty five Dollars out of my estate to be paid him by my Executor, also that my daughter Sarah Isabella Shipley when she marries have paid to her one hundred dollars, and my other daughter Mary A. Shipley who is deaf and dumb have the amount one hundred dollars paid to her and should she not marry my son Benjamin S. Shipley is to take care of her as long as she lives. I also appoint Clinton Whaley my Executor to which I have this day and date set my hand and seal.
