of Henry Lott doled. Admitted to probate County Court March term 1880.

I Henry Lott do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made as my last will and testament First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any moneys that I may die possessed of or that may first come into the hands of my Executor.

Secondly I give devise and bequeath to my following children, to wit: George Lott, John Lott, Mary, mother, Barbara Bane and Elizabeth Stokes all of my property and estate of every kind which consists altogether of personal property, each one taking a like parts share and share alike.

Thirdly I will and direct that all my property be sold to the highest bidder on the place where I last reside and that my executor give notice of the sale of my property at four public places in the County for thirty days before the sale and that he sell for cash in hand all articles not bringing over one dollar, and all the rest on a credit of twelve months taking notes with solvent security for the same.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Absalom Bunn my executor.

of Frances M. McCully doled. Admitted to probate County Court March term 1880.

I Frances McCully do make and publish this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First I direct that my funeral expenses and debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any money that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executor. Secondly I give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth E. McCully eight acres of land including the meadow before the door and orchard likewise inclusion house and kitchen household and kitchen furniture to have and hold during her natural life if she remains my widow I also bequeath unto her two head of horses and three head of cattle and as many hogs as she wants and five. I then stand the buggy and gearings. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my four children (viz) Samuel McCully, J. B. McCully, R. B. McCully and Annis T. McCully, all of whom are to have an equal share to said land and is not to be sold unless to each other without forfeiting their claim. Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Franklin Hunt my Executor in witness whereof I do to this my will set my hand and seal this 1st day of March 1879
