In the name of God Amen.
I William D. Cole of the county of Sullivan and State of Tennessee being of sound mind and memory and considering the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life do therefore make and publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament - That is to say First after all my lawful debts are paid and discharged the residue of my estate real and personal, I give bequeath and dispose of as follows viz: To my beloved wife Elizabeth I will and bequeath my land and appurtenances thereon situated my present homestead lying in the 9th civil district county and State aforesaid. Further to my beloved wife I will and bequeath all the personal property household and kitchen furniture of which I shall be seized and possessed to have and to hold during her natural life and after her death it is my Will that all my property both real and personal be sold and the proceeds go first to the liquidation of all my lawful debts - after which the remainder to be divided equally among my five children viz Margret A. Lane George S. Cole Leathrine S. Sellers Mary J. Fagan and John J. Cole.

Like wise I make constitute and appoint D. M. M. Martin to be executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal the sixteenth 16th day of December A. D. 1864.

Last Will and Testament of State of Tennessee Deceased

Knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and being a believer in the immortality of the soul and our obligations to our Creator and also to our fellow creatures I propose to make this my last Will and Testament. I revoke the will of my late husband John Hines and I was placed in possession of all the estate owned by him both Real and personal during my natural life for my own use benefit & comfort. Finding the estate in confusion at the time of the decease of my husband my wish was to pay up all the debts owing by estate which I then did without using any of said estate for my support except so much as was grown on the land which was cultivated by Thomas Curral who has lived on the farm since the death of my husband. To satisfy the demands on the estate I have paid out of my own private means arising from my pension also a balance of money loaned to H. S. Dunsberry which was repaid claimed by my husband and paid from my private estate. Of the debts of the estate I have paid from the fund I situated the following, and will have a further record also the original receipts so that no confusion may arise as to my right to collect the same out of the estate of John Hines and to use it or a part of it as I

 sum of \$731.50 Two hundred & thirty one dollar & fifty cent
 of this sum of \$731.50 will that my sister Betty Cox
 has one hundred Dallas at my death and should I
 think it best to forward the amount or a part of it at
 any time said amount is to be deducted from said
 hundred Dallas

The residue of the sum of \$731.50 being \$631.50 I give to
 my sister Sally Webb. This sum also I may give her
 before my death or may retain it as may best
 suits me if any part be paid over to her before my
 death the said will be accounted for by her and
 credited upon the amount bequeathed. Also any money
 that may be on hand at the time of my death I
 will give bequeath to Sally Webb.

Further for my comfort and benefit I give to my
 sister Sally Webb for her services to me in waiting
 upon and waiting for me the household & kitchen furniture
 now in use consisting of the following articles, One kitchen
 table 2 chairs in house - two Cupboards and wash in there -
 One Clock One Clock - 4 beds & sheets & bedding full. One
 Bureau & Dress Case - One safe - London chair. One
 Store and fixture. And all cooking utensils not
 belonging to Mrs. Carrall 2 Chests - One Chattering Nig
 nine Blanket 28 Sheet 6 Quilt 8 Core bed 5 Comate pairs
 4 Cal's Stacks - One side Padde 2 large spinning wheel
 2 little wheel - One red - One brown & 3 wash Kettle.

One Wash Kettle and a number of small articles in the
 name of Article use belonging to the household furniture -
 Two head of Cattle and measure temple of any - the last
 enumerated household articles being the labor of my own
 hand and of their benefit or use as many of them
 are old and well worn I bequeath to Sally Webb as before
 stated and further as a memorial
