Proved Aug June 1896

I John Hunt do hereby and publish this my last will and testament, here by nooking and making void all others by me or any third made

First. Having heretofore devised a portion of my lands, to J. T. Childress & Barbara A. Childress his wife during their natural lives with remainder to their children as a fee simple inheritance, another portion to John A. and James J. Coffman during their natural lives and if they should have children then to their children, should they not have issue then on their death equally to Barbara A. Childress and her heirs and another portion to Will Coffman and Mary Ann Magdalen Coffman his wife during their natural lives and then to their children as a fee simple inheritance and requiring an annual payment to me and my wife Margaret Ann Hunt each of said portions of six bushels of wheat and twenty bushels of corn during our natural lives I will and bequeath all of my personal property of every kind to gether with said annual payments of wheat and corn to my said wife during her natural life and all the rights reserved to me in said deeds

Secondly I will and bequeath to my daughter Emeline Catharine Droke wife of Wade Droke ten dollars in cash to be made from the sale of my personal property after the death of my wife I also will and bequeath to the said Emeline Catharine Droke one wheelbarrow and one brass candle stick

Thirdly I will and bequeath to Sarah Jane Hartsine five dollars in cash to be made out of the sale of my personal property after the death of my wife Margaret Ann

It is my will and I so direct that before the above bequest are paid to the said Emeline Catharine Droke and Sarah Jane Hartsine they shall execute a receipt for said bequest to my executor hereinafter named and shall in writing agree not to bring any suit against any of the estates & beneficiaries to and under this my last will and testament for any portion of my lands heretofore devised to my heirs and if they refuse to execute such instrument then I direct that the cash part of same be divided equally between my other children to wit Mary Ann Magdalen Coffman and Barbara A. Childress and that the other bequest to Sarah Jane Hartsine and Emeline Catharine Droke be sold and the proceeds be equally divided between my two daughters Mary Ann Magdalen Coffman and Barbara A. Childress

If there should be any personal property left after paying the bequests herein mentioned then I will and direct that the remainder be sold by my executor and that the proceeds be equally divided between my two daughters Mary Ann Magdalen Coffman and Barbara A. Childress

Lastly I appoint John Hunt of Blountville Tennessee executor of this my last will and testament but in the event that I should not live said John Hunt, I then appoint Charles Brown Esqr. of Blountville Tennessee my executor
