Will of John B. Riley

State of Tennessee
Sullivan County } Being afflicted by my bodily infirmities of
my approaching end, and knowing that it is appointed for all
to die by law alive testator, I do now make this my last will and
testament.

1st I will and ordain that my Executor shall first pay
all my just debts, including insurance, my funeral expenses.
2^d I will that my farm which is now divided into three
tracts or parcels shall be disposed of in the following manner
to wit

Tract No 1 I will to my daughter Mary Dune, Guster, containing
(60) sixty acres be the same more or less as is apart by the survey
made with all fixtures built and things therein described from the
designated beginning corner.

2^d I will that my son James P. W. Riley have the designated
lot (2) two containing (68) one hundred and sixty eight acres
be the same more or less as marked by a beginning corner with
marked trees &c including the house barn where I now live

3rd I will and ordain that my son James shall support
me and my wife J. D. June during my natural life.
I ordain that after my death should my wife survive me,
my son James shall support her in the family and that
he shall endeavor to make her as comfortable as his circum-
stances and the means placed at his disposal will permit.
I hope that this provision will be faithfully performed by
the parties who are to compose the family circle after
my decease.

4th I will that my son James shall have all personal
property now owned by him shall be and remain his
forever as well as the proceeds thereof.

5th I will that all the property of which my wife was
possessed at the time of my marriage with her, shall be

hers forever, to be disposed of as she may think proper, a trans-
cript of which I have left for the benefit of my Executor.
I will that the residue of my personal property on hand at
death shall equally divided between my three children.

Last- I ordain that my son James shall be my
Executor.

I will and ordain that the remaining tracts of land known
as No 3 and described by the proper boundaries in said
survey be the property of my daughter Emma Jane Oliver.

all the same where I now live with all the appurtenances thereto.

Second it is my will that Matilda Crawford wife of John H. Cran-
ford deceased shall have full possession of the above mentioned farm
all the appurtenances thereto unto her youngest child which she
now has arrived to the age of twenty-one years.

third it is my will that the above mentioned persons in the
first bequest shall pay of all expenses of a certain lawsuit that ac-
cuse plaintiff in in the Circuit Court of Sullivan County.

fourth it is my will that Josiah W. Crawford John Wesley Crawford
John Cox son of John Cox and Mary Crawford shall have all
my Mill Dams belonging to the grist mill and saw mill.

and also all my tools of every kind
fifth it is my will that the above named heirs shall pay to the
Mother John Butler one dollar and to my Brother James P Butler
one dollar and my Sister Sarah Benson one dollar and the heirs
of my Brother Abraham Butler one dollar all in current money
within twelve months after my death

Will of Nathan Bachman

I Nathan Bachman, sen. of the County of Sullivan State
of New York, being of sound mind and disposing memory
do make and publish this as my last will and testamen-
ment, hereby revoking and striking void all other wills by me
at any time made

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my
debts be paid as soon after my death as possible
out of any monies that I may die possessed of or may
first come into the hands of my executors

Secondly I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter Elizabeth
Hale in addition to the two hundred and thirty dol-
lars given her at the time of her marriage, and seven hun-
dred and five dollars since the sum of Nine hundred
and forty five dollars in cash and two town lots in the
town of Wampersport adjoining and below Greasy's old ware
house which said lots I give to her during her natural
life then to the heirs of her body forever. I give also to
my said daughter a negro woman slave named Julia and
a negro boy slave named David in like manner during

his natural life remainder over to the heirs of her body forever
Thirdly

I give and bequeath to my son Jonathan Bachman's heirs
the tract of land on which his widows did live, also two hundred
and sixty acres of land in another tract of land on the South side of
Range Mountain on which David Hickman once lived, also
one negro man slave named Dean Matier

Fourthly

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Haines
one child. In addition to the Five Hundred Dollars I gave
her at the time of her marriage my half of the lot and brick
house and other buildings thereon in the town of Ringport to
one half of the well at the corner with use of the water by
their being at one half expenses of keeping the same in repair,
also Five Hundred Dollars in cash, also one negro woman slave
named Diana and one negro boy named Sam

Fifthly

I give and bequeath to my daughter Jane Bachman
Seven Hundred Dollars in cash and the plantation I bought
of Fowler and the piece of about five acres on the north side of
Horse Creek that I once had run off for the use of that plantation
provided nevertheless the right and privilege of bringing water in
a pump or underground conveyance and repairing the same for
the same place is reserved forever and is not to be transferred
I also give to the said Jane one negro woman slave named
Mariah and one negro boy named Arch, one horse, bridle and saddle
worth one hundred dollars, two cows, eight head of sheep, ten
head of pigs to compare with three, I give my son George
two choice birds, two choice birds, bedsteads, bedding, furniture also
two thirds of the bed clothing on hands after furnish the
upstairs beds and such as I may bequeath herin the cooking
kitchen and kitchen furniture fire and iron to be divided
between her and son George (hereafter to be provided for) one
half dog in common and a like number of window shades
and tables, large family bible, one common and a small
bureau the one required at Morrisville sale the negro as above
bequeathed to be and remain to the said Jane for and during
her natural life with a remainder over to the heirs of her
body
