Will of John B. Riley

State of Pennsylvania

Sullivan County Being hampered by my bodily infirmities of
my approaching end, and knowing that it is appointed for all
to die by their own devices I do now make this my last will and
Testament.

1st I will and ordain that my Executor shall first pay
all my just debts, including executors, my funeral expenses.

2^d I will that my farm which is now divided into three
tracts or parcels shall be disposed of in the following manner
to wit

Part No 1 I will to my daughter Mary Anne, Gistler, containing
(60)六十 acres to the south line or by as far as by the survey
made with all houses built and barns therein described from the
designated beginning corner.

3^d I will that my son James P. W. Riley have the designation
No 2nd tract containing (60) one hundred and sixty eight acres
be the same tract or by as marked by a beginning corner with
marker trees &c including the barns thereon where I now live

4th I will and ordain that my son James shall support
me and my wife & I. Jane during my natural life.
I also ordain that after my death should my wife survive me,
my son James shall support her in the family and that
he shall endeavor to make her as comfortable as his circum-
stances and the means places at his disposal will permit.
I hope that this provision will be faithfully performed by
the parties who are to comprise the family circle after
my decease.

5th I will that my son James shall have all personal
property now owned by him shall be and remain his
forever as well as the proceeds thereof.

6th I will that all the property of which my wife was
possessor at the time of my marriage with her, shall be

her forever, to be disposed of as she may think proper, a trans-
cript of which I have left for the benefit of my Executor.
I will that the residue of my personal property on hand at
death, shall equally divide between my three children -
Lastly I ordain that my son James shall be my
Executor.

I will and ordain that the remaining tract of land known
as No 3rd and situated by the proper boundaries in said
survey be the property of my daughter Emma Jane Riley.

First It is my will that W. Bradford and John Wesley Gistler
sons of John H. Gistler deceased and John Cox and John
Cox and Mary Bradford wife of William Bradford and Matilda Jones
my sons and Thomas Jones and William Jones and Mary Jones and
John Jones and son Jones William of Elizabeth Jones deceased should have
all the farm where I now live with all the appurtenances thereto.

Second It is my will that Matilda Bradford wife of John H. Bran-
ford deceased shall have full possession of the above mentioned farm
all all the appurtenances thence unto her youngest child which she
now has arrived to the age of twenty one years.

Third It is my will that the above mentioned persons in the
first bequeath shall pay of all expenses of a certain law suit that we
are interested in in the Circuit Court of Sullivan County

Fourth It is my will that Josiah W. Bradford John Wesley Bradford
John Cox son of John Cox and Mary Bradford shall have all
my Mill Sins. belonging to the grist Mill and saw Mill.

and also all my tools of every kind
 fifth it is my will that the above named heirs shall pay to the
 brother John Bachman one dollar and to my Brother James P. Bachman
 one dollar and my sister Sarah Bachman one dollar and the heirs
 of my Brother Abram Bachman one dollar all in current money.
 Within twelve months after my death
 whatever I do at my hand and will to this my last will and
 testament this 3rd day of April 1865.

Will of Nathan Bachman

1st I Nathan Bachman, son, of the County of Sullivan State
 of New York, being of sound mind and disposing memory
 do make and publish this as my last will and testa-
 ment, hereby revoking & making void all other wills by me
 at any time made.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my
 debts be paid as soon after my death as possible
 out of any friends that may die prospect of or may
 first come into the hands of my executors.

Secondly - I give & bequeath to my eldest daughter Elizabeth
 Hale in addition to the Two Hundred and three doll-
 ars given her at the time of her marriage, and there-
 after and for dollars since the sum of Nine hundred
 and forty five Dollars in cash and two town lots in the
 town of Ringport adjoining and below six years old were
 house which said lots I give to her during her natural
 life then to the heirs of her body forever. I give also to
 my said daughter a negro woman slave named Julia and
 a negro boy slave named David in like manner during

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his natural life remainder over to the heirs of her body forever
 Thirdly

I give and bequeath to my son Jonathan Bachman his
 the tract of land on which his widow did live, also two hundred
 rods acres of land in another tract of land on the south side of
 Bay Mountain on which David Hickman once lived, also
 one negro man slave named Dan Baker.

Fourthly,

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary, name
 our children. In addition to the Two Hundred Dollars I gave
 her at the time of her marriage my half of the lot and brick
 house and other buildings thereon in the town of Ringport &
 one half of the well at the corner, with use of the water by
 their being at one half expense of keeping the same in repair
 also Two Hundred Dollars in Cash, also one negro woman slave
 named Diana and a negro boy named Sam.

Fifthly

I give and bequeath to my daughter Fannie Bachman
 Six Hundred Dollars in Cash and the plantation I bought
 of Gowler and the price of about Forty acres on the north side of
 Horse Creek that I once had run off for the use of that plantation
 provided nevertheless the right and privilege of bringing water in
 a pump or otherwise round Country and repairing the same for
 the home place is reserved forever and is not to be transferred.
 I also give to the said Fannie one negro woman slave named
 Maria & one negro boy named Arch, two horses, saddle & addle
 with one hundred dollars, two cows eight head of sheep, Ten
 head of swine to compare with those & give my son George
 flock of Geese - two Chickens birds, bedsteads bedding furniture etc
 & two thirds of the bed clothing on hands after furnish the
 surplus beds and such as I may bequeath herein the cooking
 utensils and kitchen furniture fire and irons to be divided
 between her & my son George (hereafter to be provided for) one
 half dozen common and a like number of Windsor chairs
 two tables, large & family bible, one common and a small
 bureau the one remained at Morrisville sale the negro as above
 bequeathed to be and remain to the said Fannie for use during
 her natural life - with a remainder over to the heirs of her
 body -
