The Last will & testament of J. M. Latture
 J. M. Latture 3^d Term 1879.

I, Sarah Latture being in full health and of sound and disposing mind do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament revoking all other wills heretofore by me made First I will my body to the ground & my soul to God who gave it second I desire that my body be decently interred and all burying and funeral expenses be paid out of any means that may be on hand.

Third I will and bequeath to my niece Margaret R. Puleher all the lands that I possess either in the State of Tennessee or in the State of Virginia. In the event that Margaret R. Puleher should die without any heirs or legal issue I desire that the above named lands shall go to my sister Rosannah Snapp and her heirs.

Fourth I will and bequeath to my niece Margaret R. Puleher my bed & all my bedding & one small Bearskin.

Fifth I will and desire that my sister Rosannah Snapp have all the remainder of my household property & also all my stock of every description.

Sixth I will and desire that all my just debts be paid, and the residue whatever it may be equally divided between my sister Rosannah Snapp and my niece Margaret R. Puleher.

Seventh I do hereby nominate and appoint Robert B. Alsos my executor in witness whereof I do this my will at my hand and seal this 18th day of November 1878

In the name of God Amen I James Latture of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee being of my full health and of my own free will and of the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and being of sound and disposing mind and making do make and ordain this to be my last and only will and testament in words and figures following to wit: In the first place I will my soul to God who gave it and my body to be to the ground from whence it was taken to be decently buried and all funeral expenses to be paid out of any means I may have on hand at my death.

2nd It is my will and desire that my beloved sister Susan Latture with whom I now live and whose unfading and never failing attention and kindness has been bestowed upon me have the full control and management of everything that I possess both in lands & personal property in Sullivan Co. Tennessee and in Scott Co. Virginia all my farming utensils household & kitchen furniture and all my stock and in fact of every thing that I possess including wagon harness &c and all articles of every description that I possess not otherwise mentioned in this my last and only will and all monies & notes &c not mentioned above to have & to hold during the term of her natural life & at her death all the above named lands personal property stock monies notes &c mentioned in this my will be equally divided between my Brother Joseph Latture deceased heirs (and personal representatives) to have and to hold (tho said) for ever and I hereby appoint my nephew James M. Latture executor to this my last will and empower him to control and manage the lands and property above mentioned, to attend to renting & collecting rents paying taxes &c and to attend to all the business for my sister Susanah Latture & that he be empowered to attend the same without any orders from Court. In witness whereof I this day affix my hand and seal. This the 10th day of March 1879.
