Fifthly, I will and bequeath to my youngest daughter Malinda Hicks, one bag, mill, and one hundred Dollars in cash and an equal part of the house held jointly with the sons at home. (to wit) John C. W. C. Mary Hicks my wife and that she live with her mother until she marries or till the death of her mother.

Sixthly - I will and bequeath unto my two daughters Sarah W. Barry and Margaret Barry each as follows: - To Sarah W. Barry Two hundred and fifty Dollars, and to Margaret Barry One hundred and fifty Dollars, and that John C. and William C. Hicks pay to each of my daughters the amount of money set to their names and called by me to them in the time of four years after my death.

And lastly I will and bequeath to my Grandson William Sarah Hicks Ten Dollars: And appoint my two sons William C. and John C. Hicks my Executors. In Witness whereof I do to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal, this the 6th day of May 1869

I order and appoint John W. Bagley as executor of this my last will and Testament.
