I John Barter of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form as following that is to say first I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Nancy Barter all of my personal and real estate during her natural life.

2- I will to daughter Ruth Coover one Hundred Dollars,

3- I will and bequeath to my daughter Lucretia Lady one Hundred Dollars.

4- I will to my daughter Elizabeth Hale, one Hundred Dollars- I will my daughter Rebecca Buncan one Hundred Dollars-

6- I will my daughter Marnah J. Morgan one Hundred Dollars-

7- I will my grand children Nancy, Jonathan and James Albert Barter, thirty three Dollars, thirty three and two third Cents each-

8- I will and bequeath to my son Nathan L. Barter my tract of land 94 acres be the same more or less and all the personal property at my death and the death of my wife Nancy Barter, provided the sd. Nathan L. Barter pays to each of the above named heirs the same I have designated in two years from our deaths. We agree that the said Nathan L. Barter have at his disposal all the surplus that is not needed the said N. L. Barter live to the end of our mortal lives if he should not I will that all of the above named heirs with his have an equal share in land and property that may remain after our death, only the monies or properties that he may make after our support lastly I do appoint my trusty friend Nathan L. Barter my executor to this our last will and testament

The last will of Jonathan Buckellus Decd.

I Jonathan Buckellus do make and publish this as my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made-

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all of my debts to be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any monies that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my executor. Secondly I give and bequeath to my wife Mary my Bay horse, one looking glass, and also what money I may have on hand at my death.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my grand son Jonathan Millard, one bed and bed clothes. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Beyer Cox, one Bureau and Book Case. Fifthly I give and bequeath to my son A. B. Buckellus my set of black Smith tools and one cupboard and one Cargo Case, and one small table, and one Camble stand. Sixthly I give and bequeath to my son W. H. Buckellus and my grand son W. H. Willard and A. H. Wixler, and Wm W. Wixler and Joseph Wixler and Pally Wixler, my library of Books to be equally divided between them. I do hereby nominate and appoint my son A. B. Buckellus my executor.
