The Last Will & Testament of John W. Blerius

In the name of God Amen. I John W. Blerius of
Sullivan County and State of Tennessee do make and
publish this my last will and testament in manner
and form following: That is to say I first direct
that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid im-
mediately after my decease. I then first I give and be-
queath to my wife Margaret my black mare, also
one bid of her own selection, and all necessary
bed clothing to make it comfortable. I also give and
devise to my wife Margaret possession full possession
of my dwelling house, the one I now reside in, she
is also to draw her support from that part of my
lands that I now reside upon lying west of the
division line run by James Mitchell per and during
her natural life

Then second. I give and devise to my daughter
Catherine Edell that tract or parcel of land lying
on the east side of my old survey and detached
from that part of my lands that I now reside
upon by a division line of the same as above by
Jas. Mitchell and containing by estimation two hun-
dred and fifty and one fourth acres more or less
and bounded as follows. Beginning at a spruce
pine on the river bank a red corner to a division
line S 8 1/2 E 61 P to a chestnut S 1/4 N 15 P to a poplar
S 34 E 55 P to a sycamore S 1/4 N 34 P to a stake

Sullivan County, Tennessee

S 7 1/2 N 17 1/2 P to a stake S 77 E 43 P to a white oak S 88 E 120
P to a poplar S 68 E 22 P to a white oak S 39 E 6 to a walnut
new corner on old line S 68 E 101 P to poplars S 82 E 68 P to a
fallen birch on the river bank S 68 E N 32 P with the river
S 35 N 24 P S 62 N 65 P S 78 N 14 P S 65 N 67 P S 48 N 61 P
S 70 N 88 P S 63 N 14 P to the Beginning. Which one
described tract of land to the said Catherine Edell and
to her and her child and I will and devise it forever.
Then third, I will and devise to my daughter Ruth
Shipley and to her children all that part of my lands
lying west of a division line run by Jas. Mitchell contain-
ing by estimation about two hundred and eighty seven
acres more or less, with the promise that my wife Mar-
garet as before stated is to hold possession of my dwell-
ing house the same that I now reside in during her
natural life and draw her support from the products
of said land.

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Ruth
Shipley and her children all my personal estate
of every kind and description, to her and her children
I devise it forever.

Then fourth. I nominate and appoint my two sons
in law, James Shipley and David Edell my executors
to this my last will and testament hereby revoking and
making void all wills or testaments heretofore made
by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my seal. This April 24th 1871
