Wills Admitted to Record in Sullivan County Court.

In the name of God Amen, I Robert P. Rhea of the County of
Sullivan and State of Tennessee being weak in body,
but of sound mind and memory (blessed be God) do this day
make and publish this my last Will and Testament
in manner following, that is to say, first I give
and bequeath to my beloved wife Nancy and to our
three children Margaret, Mary R. and Matthew Rhea
all my household and kitchen furniture, all my
farming utensils all my cattle and milk cows,
all one sheep and hogs, and all my horses except the
young grey mare, which I wish to be considered as
the property of my daughter Mary to be enjoyed in
common Hoping that they may all live together in the
old mansion house in peace as long as my wife may
live, and at my said beloved wife's death my said
children Margaret, Mary R. and Matthew will divide
all the said property with the increase if any or such
as may remain equally between them. 2^d When it
becomes necessary that is at the death of my wife to
divide all the real estate amongst our children
giving to each of the eight children an equal share
in the old tract, I give and bequeath to my daughter
Margaret and Mary R. my eleven acres secured by
entry in two parcels adjoining the old tract to them
and their heirs forever independent of their shares in
the old tract.

3^d Item I also give and bequeath my seven shares
(\$2500) of stock in the East Tennessee and
Virginia Rail Road to my daughter Margaret and
Mary R. Rhea to their own proper use and benefit.
I hereby appoint and constitute my dear son Robert
C. Rhea my executor of this my last will.
