ah Grabley next my will is that all our funeral and burial expenses to be paid and all our just debts out of our property after our death.

After my just debts and funeral expenses paid as my will and desire that our beloved son George W. Grabley and our beloved son Benjamin T. Grabley have each five Dollars given to them when the property is sold. I will and bequeath to my beloved daughter Sarah A. wife of James White five Dollars at the time above stated. To the remaining three daughters viz Mary and H. Mary Elizabeth W. Grabley for and in consideration of their services to me and my dear wife their filial care and regard for us. I will and bequeath unto

thine all the rest remainder or residue of my property of what kind soever, both of real estate, as land, timber, stock or moveable property to be equally divided between them, which several legacies shall be apportioned to my several heirs as are named at the time of my said.

Will of John Curtiss Jr.

I the man of God Amen, I John Curtiss of the County of Sullivan and state of New York being in perfect health of body and of sound mind and memory and understanding blessed be God for the same, but Considering the uncertainty of this transitory life do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit, Principally and first of all I command my immortal soul into the hands of God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner and as to such words estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath in the following manner.

First It is my desire that my debts and funeral expenses

to paid out of my personal property. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my living wife a sufficient support out of my real estate during her natural life also one negro boy named William, And one horse and saddle, four beds and furniture and Cupboard and fireplace and tables, Chests and to occupy at least one room in the house which property he is to dispose of as she thinks proper.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my step daughter Anna Johnson and her heirs one negro boy named Washington. Thirteenth I give and bequeath to my grand son John Johnson Jr. of Benjamin Johnson the lower end of my plantation beginning at a corner on David. Sand grass line, thence a north west course with Benjamin Johnson's line to a Chestnut corner in the field north of the Island road, thence the same direction until it starts on the line, also one negro boy named Dick. Fourteenth I give and bequeath to my grandson Walter Johnson of Benjamin Johnson, one negro boy named Henry.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Wm. Johnson all the my lands at the upper east end of my plantation to run with the line above described.

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my Grand daughter Jane Johnson daughter of Benjamin Johnson one negro boy named Bedwards.

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my grand son Master Johnson of Johnson one negro boy named Jerry.

Eighthly I give to my daughter Eliza Johnson one negro man named Tom and one negro woman named Sarah. Ninthly I give and bequeath unto my son and daughter Elizabeth Johnson daughter of John Johnson one horse called Stock Saddle and saddle and one Bed and furniture. Tenthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Bowdry Two Hundred Dollars to be paid out of the proceeds of my personal property and lands after my debts are paid. Eleventhly I give and bequeath to my step son John Johnson a 1/6 my interest in a tract of land in Coopers Valley, See County which Land Licklow has brought suit for.

And lastly I appoint John Johnson son of Benjamin and Walter Johnson my executors. I also make this my last will Testament, revoking and making void all former wills and bequests, by me, at any time herefore made, or executed.
