

Will of John Horn Ward

In the name of God Amen. I John Horn do hereby make and publish this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First I desire and command my soul into the hands of God my creator in hope of a glorious immortality.

Secondly. I desire that my body should be decently buried and my funeral expenses and all my just debts be paid and as to what little worldly goods it pleased God to give and beleave upon me I dispose of in the following manner.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath to my oldest son Charles Horn and to his heirs forever that plantation where he now lives which is called the Bushy place.

Fourthly. I give and bequeath to my second son George Horn and to his heirs forever the plantation where he now lives.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath to my four youngest sons Benjamin and John Horn and to them and their heirs forever the old home plantation with thirty five acres lying through the gulf and fifty acres in the ridge after my death, and after my death the mill place and all my real and personal estate is to be sold that I bear no charge set of in this will. I also give and bequeath to my daughter Polly genes six hundred dollars, and I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Lark one hundred dollars, and I give and bequeath to my daughter Anna Right six hundred dollars and I give to John and his wife Elizabeth Gray five dollars, and I bequeath to my son Charles Horn one hundred dollars, and I bequeath to John Right my sixteen year old the son of Nelson Right and the balance to be equally divided among Charles Horn, George Horn, Benjamin Horn, John Horn, Polly genes, Sarah Lark, Anna Right. I do here nominate and appoint my sons George Horn and Benjamin Horn my Executors. In witness whereof I do make this my will and set my hand and seal this eleventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Susan my chit and sofa to her and her heirs. Fourthly. I will and direct that all the remainder of my household and Kitchen furniture be equally distributed among my four daughters viz Mary Susan Elizabeth Pleasant Gravity Sarah Thomas and Melinda Powell to them and their heirs.

Fifthly. I will and direct that my black woman Rebecca may (after my death) hire the the one of my daughters above mentioned hiring it documentary with herself which one of them to chose to live with.

sixthly. I will and direct that my negro girl Caroline be sold and the proceeds equally divided among my four daughters above named and to their heirs.

seventhly. I will and direct that what money I may be possessed of at my death be equally divided among my four daughters above named or their heirs.

Lastly. I do hereby nominate and appoint David Rose my Executor. I do witness whereof, I do to this my last will set my hand and seal this 5th day of May 1857
