all my debts be paid as soon as possible
after my death out of my money that I
may die possessed or may first come
with the hands of my executor.Secondly I give and bequeath unto my wife
Mary J. King during her natural life the
farm upon which I now reside lying in
the West of Sullivan County containing about
one hundred and fifteen acres more or less
adjoining the land of Mr. Hawks and others
and at the death of my wife I will the said
farm be divided between my daughter, Annie
M. King and my son, Charles E. King equally
in acres but in such a manner as to give
to Annie M. King the Mansion House.Thirdly I will and bequeath unto my son Jonathan
M. King all the benefits of a certain Capitation
and made by Peter Dutton to me by a deed
or parcel of Mountain land lying in Smyth
County Virginia containing three hundred and fifty
acres more or less lying on Big Bear Creek
a branch of Smiths Fall of Haleson River and
further if it becomes necessary to perfect the titleto said land I direct that my executors pay the
amount of two hundred and fifty dollars
to the said Jonathan M. King for the purpose
of procuring the complete title to said Mountain
land under the terms of my contract with
said Peter Dutton and if the said Peter Dutton
elect to pay the amount due me then the aforesaid
Jonathan M. King is to have the sum of five
hundred dollars paid to him by my executors.Fourthly I will and direct that my
son Edward P. King be sent to school for the term
of ten months and if at that time his literary ac-
quirements are sufficient then I will that pro-
vision be made for his taking a full course
in medicine the money necessary to pay
the expenses of both his literary and medical
sign education to come from the proceeds
of any rights on the sale of any property
not heretofore bequeathed which I may own
and the proceeds of the farm in which I
reside. I further will that Eddie remain
at home and assist in conducting the
business of the farm during the time he
is completing his education and obtaining
his profession.Fifthly I will and direct that my son
