The last Will & Testament of
John Kellron Ordered to be set up as the
original will of John Kellron
July term 1891

In the name of God Amen: I John Kellron
of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee
being in a weak state of body & health but of perfect
and disposing mind memory and understanding
considering the certainty of death and the uncertainty
of time and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs
and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world
when it shall please the Lord to call me home I
do therefore make and publish this my last will
and Testament in the manner and form following
viz 1st I will that Catherine my wife shall have
and hold all my land for her support as long as she
shall live (the interest I have in that tract of land
wherein James G. Hicks now lives excepted)
2nd I will that Catherine my wife have all my
household and kitchen furniture with beds & bedding
also one cow and six head of sheep one horse and
maintainance for one year.
3rd I will that Polly Hicks and her heirs have
and forever hold the land herein above excepted.
4th I will that all other things or property be
sold and the proceeds be equally divided between
Joseph Kellron, Susannah Kellron, Polly Kellron
and Eliza Jane Pannel.
5th I will that all notes in my hands or
accounts be collected and the money be
equally divided in five shares: I will that
Catherine my wife have one fifth part with
the above named Joseph Susannah & Kellron and
Eliza Jane Pannel.

6th I will that after Catherine my wife shall have left this world there all my land equally divided between the above named persons viz. Joseph, Susanah and Polly Kitterick except I Eliza Jane Samuel her part is to be exclusively set apart for the use of her and her children.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Samuel B. Gaines and Catherine Kitterick my Executors for this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all former wills and acknowledge this to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal.
