Will of George Crumley Sr.

I George Crumley do make and publish this as my last will and Testament duly signed and making void all other wills by me made.

1st I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debt be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any monies that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my Executor.

2nd I give and bequeath unto my two youngest sons David and Philip my plantation containing eighty one acres more or less and my other property of every kind horses cattle sheep pigs and every other kind which I may possess of to be equally divided.

3rd I do direct that my beloved wife herself shall be well supported by my two sons David and Philip and that she shall have possession of my house as she may choose.

4th I do give and bequeath to my daughter Ruth one bed and bedding one cow and one horse some immovables settle when ever she may need it. 5th I do give and bequeath unto my son Jacob one dollar and also to my son Philip one dollar to my son George one dollar to my son David one dollar to my son Andrew one dollar. 6th I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth one dollar my daughter Mary one dollar my daughter Susanna one dollar my daughter Sarah one dollar my daughter Catherine being one dollar unto my daughter Peggy one dollar and I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy one dollar also unto my daughter Patsy one dollar also unto my daughter Lucinda one dollar to be paid by my Executor out of my property after my death.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my two youngest sons David and Philip Crumley my Executors and shall not be bound to give security for this performance. In witness whereof I do this my will set my hand and seal.

Will of Jonathan Bachman.

I Jonathan Bachman of Sullivan County State of Tennessee do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any monies that I may die possessed of or that may first come into the hands of my Executor. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Eight hundred dollars in cash out of my white choice horse saddle & saddle two choice cows and calves one half of all my household and kitchen furniture kept two bedsteads and bedding and my Black mare Allen. My wife is to have the above mentioned property and money to do with as she thinks proper except Allen she is to have so long as she lives. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah McCallan formerly Hannah Bachman & to her two sons John & James if my sons John or James should die before my wife's death as doubtless I should have for my son John my Black mare Allen at the death of my wife Martha. Two choice horses Lewis & Ira I have the privilege of bringing or carrying the water from the south side of the main horse creek as I please down South fork she is to have an equal share with the rest of my children in all the debts or money due me by note or account at my death. All my Black Smith tools and my farming utensils of all kind she is to have all my household and kitchen furniture except two bedsteads & bedding she is to have all my pigs also the following described tract of land situated in the aforesaid County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river, including the house where the said Jonathan Bachman now lives which land I have made the said Hannah a widow to some time back beginning at a large Spanish Oak on the Bank of Horse Creek in the division between the said Jonathan & his Brother Nathan Bachman thence with said division line and fifty three West Twenty Poles to a stake thence North eight West fifty of Poles to a Black walnut thence North eleven degrees East fifty two Poles to a stake thence a line a lane with Seventy three West fifty of Poles to a stake in a field thence North fifty West thirty four Poles to a white oak thence North fifty West eight Poles to a white oak thence South twenty & half degrees West eighty nine Poles to a white oak corner of a tract started to Gedy Bond thence with several of the lines thereof South South ten East forty two Poles to a white oak thence South twenty west four Poles to a white oak at a gap in the Rocks thence South fifty eight West ninety four Poles to a white oak poplar & dogwood thence with the part laid off for Sarah Russell South fifty five East fifty two Poles to a white oak and Rocking spring her corner thence South eighty four East one hundred and ten Poles to a stake

in the middle of horse creek thence with Nathan Bachman a firsing his corner at the mouth of the clear fork down the middle of horse creek in all one hundred and eighty poles to the Beginning. Containing two hundred acres be the same more or less the before mentioned deed has now been recorded. It is to have all the crops of all kind that is growing on the above mentioned tract of land at my death and all the grain hay and so that is on hand at my death after paying the debt out of it up to the sale after my death. I do not choose settle after my wife's choice all my gear and poultry of every kind fifteen choice sheep.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Bond formerly Catherine Bachman I have heretofore given her a negro girl that cost me three hundred dollars after that I gave the balance of my first wife's children three hundred dollars (each of them) to make them equal with said Catherine. I give to said Catherine Bond & to her heirs so forever the following described tract of land situated in the above said County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river. Beginning at a Black and White oak corner of Sarah Maxwell on John Peoples old line on the top of a ridge thence with her line N 49 E 87 poles to a white oak Poplar & Sycamore corner to the tract where said Bachman now lives thence with the following lines N 33 E 94 poles to a white oak at a gap in the Banks thence N 30 E 114 poles to a white oak thence N 10 W 112 poles to a white oak David Bachman's corner thence S 65 W 6 poles to Horse creek where a Branch runs in thence up said creek to meanders 90 poles to a Sycamore Elm on the west Bank of said creek thence N 83 W 134 poles to a double on the Bank of said creek thence crossing the same West 11 poles to a Sycamore sapling thence South one hundred and nineteen poles to a Black walnut thence N 25 poles to a Post oak thence N 10 W 82 poles to a Post oak and two Black oak saplings Thomas Bachman's corner thence with his line S 50 E 87 poles to a white oak on John Peoples line at his field thence with his line north 60 poles to his corner Post oak thence with his line S 110 E 138 poles to the Beginning containing and twenty seven acres be the same more or less. Since long Back I made said Catherine a deed to the above mentioned tract of land and was never recorded. Fifthly, I give and bequeath to the wife and children of my son David Bachman said the following described tract of land to them and their heirs forever said tract of land is situated in the above said County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river and bounded as follows to wit. Beginning at a white oak Catherine Bonds corner in a line of the tract said Nathaniel Bachman now lives on thence with said line N 21 W 87 poles to a white oak corner of Nathaniel Bachman's thence with his line N 87 E 95 1/2 poles to a white oak thence N 60 W 6 1/2 poles to a white oak on a spring hill thence S 110 W 38 poles to a white oak thence N 62 W 116 poles to a Poplar & Hickory thence West fifty poles to two white oaks said Nathan Bachman's corner thence North 52 W 119 poles to a white oak on a hill side thence S 55 W 116 poles to a white oak thence West 63 poles crossing Nathaniel Bachman's two meadows to a sugar tree white oak and Spanish oak thence South 11 E 109 poles to a white oak near a Branch thence North 75 E 15 poles to a Sycamore sapling Catherine Bonds corner near said Branch thence with her line crossing said Branch East 11 poles

to a Birch her corner thence with her line S 35 E 134 poles to a Sycamore and close on the Bank of Horse creek her corner thence with her line down the meanders of said creek 90 poles to the mouth of a Branch thence with her line N 65 E 6 poles to the Beginning. Containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less. My son Nathan W. Bachman is to have five hundred dollars in part of a debt that my son David was due said Nathan out of the money that will be coming to said David's wife & children out of my estate hereafter mentioned and given to them in this will. Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my son Nathan W. Bachman and to his heirs so forever the following described tract of land situated in the above said County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river First tract Beginning at a stake at the mouth of clear fork of Horse creek where it crosses with horse creek thence S 111 W 114 poles to a stake & cedar Point thence S 60 E 28 poles to a planted stone near the great mill thence S 117 E 26 poles crossing said fork to a Black sugar tree thence S 60 E 10 1/2 poles to a white oak thence S 2 E 18 poles to a stake at the corner of the mill dam thence S 15 E 35 poles to a white walnut thence crossing said fork N 38 E 30 poles to the center of two sugar tree saplings Hickory & dogwood among some rocks thence N 11 W 28 poles to Rock stone in the road on John Bonds line thence with his line crossing said fork N 101 poles to a white oak on a ridge thence North 11 1/2 W 116 poles to a stake on the Bank of horse creek thence down said creek as it meanders 58 poles to the Beginning containing one hundred acres be the same more or less second tract Beginning at a dead white oak in a lane thence through the head of a spring S 15 W 52 poles to a Persimmon Maple & dogwood on the clear fork of horse creek thence up the meanders of said fork S 2 W 21 poles to a stake on the center of said fork on John Bonds line thence with the same S 86 poles to a white oak steep near a black Printer thence N 15 W 75 poles to a walnut near a Buckeye & Hickory Point thence S 83 W 153 poles to the Beginning containing and one half acres be the same more or less. It is hereby understood that said Nathan W. Bachman is to have the liberty to build any other water works on the first mentioned tract except a grist mill. Since long Back I made said Nathan W. Bachman a deed to the above mentioned tracts of land and they was never recorded. Seventhly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Peoples formerly Rebecca Bachman & to her heirs so forever the following described tract of land situated in the above said County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river Beginning at Joseph Smiths old corner white oak or where said white oak stood on John Peoples old Point line thence with the said old line to a white oak corner of said old grant thence with a line of the same N 112 poles to a stake near a marked oak where a white oak stood John Bonds corner thence with his line S 1 W 12 poles to a stake thence S 60 W 90 poles to a Black and small Hickory thence S 24 W 35 poles to a double white oak & Black oak. So Charles corner thence with his line east one hundred and twenty seven poles to a Hickory thence south fourteen poles to a stake on said Charles old line corner of Joseph Smiths old grant & corner of James Charles thence with a line of said old grant East 62 poles to a stake near a large Black oak & Chestnut thence S 129 poles to a Black oak on a south hill side the said Smiths old corner thence with said line of the said old grant to the place of Beginning. Containing one hundred and

sixty seven acres to the same more or less. Some time back I made the said Rebecca a deed to the above mentioned and it was never recorded.

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Murrell and to her heirs &c. for ever the following described tract of land situated in the aforesaid County of Sullivan on the South side of the Hudson river. Beginning at a forked white oak on a rocky Hill thence N 89° 30' Poles to the middle of Horse Creek thence down said creek as it meanders 60 Poles to two Sycamore saplings on the west Bank of said creek at the mouth of a small Branch thence up said Branch N 80° 41' 18" Poles to a white oak and Buckeye sapling thence with a line of the tract where said Bachman lies N 34° 43' 32" Poles to a white oak Poplar and digewood Catherine Bonds corner thence with her line S 41° 48' 37" Poles to a black oak & white oak sapling on the top of a ridge on the Poplar line thence with his line S 41° 8' 18" Poles to his corner digewood and ash thence with his line S 72° 2' 26" Poles to his corner white oak thence with his line S 72° 4' 32" Poles crossing Horse Creek to the middle of a spring known by the name of Anthony's spring thence with said Poplar line up a branch S 67° 52' Poles to a double sugar tree his corner thence with his line north forty four Salish a digewood thence West 6 Poles to the Beginning containing one hundred and thirty nine acres be the same more or less. Some time back I made said Sarah Murrell formerly Sarah Bachman a deed to the before mentioned tract of land and said deed was never recorded. Some years back I gave my son Theo Bachman three hundred and eighty acres of land in said County of Sullivan on the South side of Hudson river. Some years back I gave my son Salomon Bachman two hundred of land in said County of Sullivan on the South side of Hudson river. Some years back I gave my daughter Rachel Peoples formerly Rachel Bachman seven hundred dollars in cash.

Ninthly I give and bequeath to my first wife children all my lands that is not before mentioned and bequeathed in this will all my negroes that is not mentioned and bequeathed in this will all my personal property of all kinds that is not mentioned and bequeathed in this will to be sold & equally divided between my first wife children by Executors & to sell the above mentioned property real & personal as soon as they can after the will is proven in court giving at least thirty days notice at three or more public places in town & within time &c. My children by my first wife and last wife is all to be equal in all the cash in hand debts money due me by note or account at the time of my death.

Tenthly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Nathan W Bachman my son in law William McClellan my Executors, I do hereby declare that I do to this my will set my hand and seal this 24th day of May 1845.

I Jonathan Bachman having heretofore made and published my last will & Testament do make and declare this as a Codicil thereto. I have this day sold to Wm McClellan the above mentioned two hundred and eighty acres of land that I had intended for the heirs of my son David Bachman they being desirous to have I intend to pay them the money in place of the land before they start. Since this will was written my beloved wife departed this life and I have paid her heirs or that is to say my step children all I intend them to have out of my estate. The five hundred dollars that my son Nathan W Bachman is to have out of my son David Bachman's heirs interest is to come out of their interest in my land & negroes that is not heretofore disposed of in this my will and it is to be sold as heretofore mentioned, it is my desire that this codicil be attached to & constitute a part of my will to all intents and purposes this 13 day of Sept 1847.

Secondly I give and bequeath to George Goodman one hundred one hundred and being on two year old colt that I purchased for my wife can have five hundred dollar out of my estate to get her a little and saddle. I give and bequeath to my grand son John David the balance of my plantation supposed to be one hundred acres be the same more or less Beginning at my corner bar going all around it my red can my gray mare my bed I sleep in including the bedstead and bedding. Margaret Dickins to have the place where she lives that is to say the house and garden for five years by paying ten dollars for room & schooling the children. I give and bequeath to my Grand son Walter James (my own Charles son) and his sister Mrs Sutton one hundred and fifty dollars out of my estate when the same place is sold. I give & bequeath to my Grand son Wm Shivers and his sister Mrs Wells one hundred &
