### Will of George Crumley No. 2

I George Crumley do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills and making void all other wills by me made.

1<sup>st</sup> I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any monies that I may die possessed of or may first come into the hands of my Executor.

2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath unto my two youngest sons David and Phillip my plantation containing eighty one acres more or less and my other property of every kind horses cattle sheep pigs and every other kind which I may be possessed of to be equally divided.

3<sup>rd</sup> I direct that my beloved wife Zephyr shall be well supported by my two sons David and Phillip and that she shall have reasonable prospect of my house as she may choose.

4<sup>th</sup> I do give and bequeath to my daughter Ruth one bed and bedding one cow and one horse one remains saddle when ever she may want it. Fifth, I do give and bequeath unto my son David one dollar and also to my son Phillip one dollar to my son George one dollar to my son Andrew one dollar. Sixthly, I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth one dollar my daughter Mary one dollar my daughter Susanna one dollar my daughter Sarah one dollar my daughter Catherine has one dollars, unto my daughter Peggy one dollar and I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy one dollar also unto my daughter Peggy one dollar also unto my daughter Fonda one dollar to be paid by my Executor out of my property after my death.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my two youngest sons David and Phillip Crumley my Executor and shall not be bound to give security for this performance In witness whereof I do this my will set my hand and seal.

### Will of Jonathan Bachman

I Jonathan Bachman of Sullivan County & State of Tennessee do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all other wills by me at any time made. First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out any monies that I may die possessed of or that may first come into the hands of my Executor. Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Martha Eight hundred dollars in cash out of my estate choice Horse bridle & saddle, two choice cows and calves one half of all my household and kitchen furniture right for bed sheets and bedding and my Black man Allen. My wife is to have the above mentioned property and money to do with as she thinks proper except Allen who is to have as long as she lives. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah McMillan formerly Honah Bachman & her heirs so forever chuse if my other girls or women in her family & sisters such as daughters & stepdaughters four per Dragon Years my Black man Allen at the death of my wife Martha. Our choice Horses bridle & saddle the privilege of bringing in money the water from from the south side of the main horse creek as I have done heretofore fine. She is to have an equal share with the rest of my children in all the debts or money due me by note or account at my death. all my Black Smith tools all my fowling pieces of all kind she is to have all my household and kitchen furniture except the bed sheets & bedding she is to all my dogs, also the following divided tract of land situated in the aforesaid County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river, including the fence where the said Jonathan Bachman now lies which land I gave unto the said Honah a tract to some lone Brook Beginning at a large Spanish Oak on the bank of horse creek in the division between the said Jonathan & his Brother Nathaniel Bachman; there with said division line runneth fifty three West Twenty Poles to a stake thence North with forty eight Poles to a black walnut tree North eleven degrees East fifty two Poles to a stake thence a line a lane north seventy three West forty six Poles to a stake in a field thence with forty West Thirtys four Poles to a white oak thence North fifty nine and a half Poles to a white oak, thence south twenty & half degrees West eighty nine Poles to a white oak corner of a tract owned to Colby Bond, thence with several of the lines thereof South South ten East forty two Poles to a white oak thence South twenty West fourteen Poles to a white oak at a gap in the woods, thence South fifty eight West, nearly four Poles to a white oak poplar, dogwood thence with the part laid off ye lands on small South fifty four East fifty two Poles to a white oak and Buckeye, covering her corner, thence South eight four East one hundred and ten Poles to a white

in the middle of horse creek with Nathan Bachman a piping his corner at the mouth of the clear fork down the middle of horse creek in all one hundred and eighty Poles to the Beginning containing two hundred acres be the same more or less the before mentioned deed has now been recorded. He is to have all the crops of all kind that is growing on the above mentioned tract of land at my death and all the grain hay and so that is on hand at my death after paying the debts out of it up to the sole after of death we must abide cattle after my wife's choice all my geese and Poultry of every kind fifteen choice sheep.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my daughter Catherine Bond formerly Catherine Bachman I have four given her a new girl that cost me three hundred dollars after that I gave the balance of my first wife's children three hundred dollars (each of them to) to make them equal with said Catherine. I give to said Catherine Bond & to her heirs & forever the following described tract of land situated in the aforesaid County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river Beginning at a black and white oak corner of Sarah Murrell on John Peoples old line on the top of a ridge thence with her line 44 Poles to a white oak Peoples & Joseph corner to the tract where said Bachman now lives thence with the following lines 2858 844 Poles to a white oak at a girt on the bank thence N 30 E 14 Poles to a white oak then S 10 W 32 Poles to a white oak David Bachman's corner thence S 66 W 6 Poles to Bear creek where a branch runs in thence up said creek to meander 46 Poles to a sycamore tree on the west Bank of said creek thence S 135 W 134 Poles to a bush on the Bank of said creek thence defining the same west 40 Poles to a sycamore sapling three fourths one hundred and nineteen poles to black walnut thence W 96 Poles to a Dist oak thence S 10 W 88 Poles to a Dist oak and two black oak saplings Thomas Bachman's corner thence with his line S 45 E 87 Poles to a white oak on John Peoples line at his field thence with his line north 60 Poles to his corner Dist oak thence with his line S 118 E 128 Poles to the Beginning containing and twenty seven acres be the same more or less. Seven long bush I made said Catherine a deed to the above mentioned tract of land and had never recorded. Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my son Nathan W Bachman and to his heirs & forever the following described tract of land situated in the aforesaid County of Sullivan, on the south side of Holston river First tract Beginning at a stake at the mouth of clear fork of Horse creek where it empties into horse creek thence S 141 E 44 Poles to a stake & cedar thence S 66 W 38 Poles to a planted stone near the first mill stone S 117 E 96 poles cropping said Pk to a black sugartree thence S 600 E 144 Poles to a white oak thence S 2 1/2 E 18 Poles to a stake at the corner of the mill dam thence S 145 E 34 Poles to a white walnut thence cropping said Pk S 73 E 30 Poles to the center of two sugar tree saplings Hickory & dogwood among some rocks thence S 11 W 32 Poles to Rock stone in the road and John Bachman's line thence with his line cropping said Pk N 100 Poles to a white oak on a ridge thence North 113 W 116 Poles to a stake on the Bank of horse creek thence down said creek as it meanders 58 Poles to the Beginning containing one hundred acres be the same more or less second tract Beginning at a dead white oak in a lane thence through the head of a spring S 15 W 52 Poles to a persimmon tree & dogwood on the clear fork of horse creek thence up the meanders of said fork S 12 W 34 Poles to a stake in the center of ad fork on John Peoples line thence with the same S 86 Poles to a white oak which was a knot Pine tree S 115 W 75 Poles to a walnut near a Hickory & Hickory thence S 135 N 75 S 118 Poles to the Beginning containing and one half acre be the same more or less. Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Peoples formerly Rebecca Bachman & her heirs & forever the following described tract of land situated in the aforesaid County of Sullivan on the south side of Holston river Beginning at Joseph Smith's old corner white oak corner of John Peoples old corner & line thence with the said old line to a white oak corner of said old grant thence with a line of the same W 133 Poles to a stake near a marked ash where a white oak stand John Peoples corner thence with his line S 17 W 10 Poles to a stake thence S 26 N 90 Poles to a black and small Hickory thence S 24 W 88 Poles to a double white oak & black oak. To Charles corner thence with his line east one hundred and seven seven Poles to a Hickory thence south fourteen poles to a stake on said Crawford's old line corner of Joseph Smith's old grant & corner of John's Charles thence with a line of said old grant East 63 Poles to a stake near a big black oak & his next thence N 129 Poles to a black oak on a south hill side the said Smith's old corner thence with said line of the said old grants to the place of beginning containing one hundred and

to a white oak and Ash tree affling them with a line of the tract where said  
Bachman lines N 34 W 32 Poles to a white oak Poplar and dogwood Catherine  
Bonds corner thence with his line N 18 W 87 Poles to a Black Oak & white oak sep-  
aring on the top of a ridge on the Peoples line thence with his line N 11 E S 138 Poles  
to his common dogwood and Ash thence up his line N 72 E 26 Poles to his corner  
white oak thence with his line N 72 N S 62 Poles crossing horse creek to the middle  
of a spring knownly the name of Anthony's Spring thence with said Peoples line

ael Peoples formerly Rachel Bachman seven hundred dollars in cash.

Ninety. I give and bequeath to my first wife's children all my lands that is  
not before mentioned and bequeathed in this will all my negroes that is not mentioned  
and bequeathed in this will all my personal property of all kinds that is not men-  
tioned and bequeathed in this will to be sold & equally divided between my  
first wife's children my Executor is to sell the above mentioned property real &  
personal as soon as they can after the will is proven in court giving at least  
thirty days notice at three or more public places on twelve months time &c. My  
children by my first wife and last wife is to be equal in all the cash in hand  
debt money due me by note or account at the time of my death.

Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Nathan H Bachman my son  
in law William McClellan my Executors. In witness whereof I do to this my

by paying ten dollars for you in ~~when~~ the children. I give and bequeath to my  
Grand son Walter James (my own brother son) and his wife Mrs Nathan one hundred  
and fifty dollars out of my estate when the new place is sold. I give &  
bequeath to my grand son Tom Starns and his wife Mrs Wells one hundred &
