Will of Joseph Hobaugh

In the name of God Amen.

Joseph Hobaugh, being weak in body, but sound in
mind, and of disposing memory, falling to mind the
uncertainty of life, and desirous of settling all my
worldly affairs, do make and publish this my last
will and testament, and hereby revoke and annul
all other wills heretofore made by me.

And 1st I bequeath my soul to God who gives it, trusting
in the merits of the Lord for my eternal rest hereafter.

And 2nd I desire that all my just debts shall be paid
by my Executor or Administrators, no one shall be
Executor shall survive, so soon after my decease as
Convenient and practicable.

And 3rd I will and bequeath all my personal estate
household and kitchen furniture, stock &c &c of every
kind and description to Robert R. Anderson and
Winnis C. Anderson his wife formerly C. Boy, my niece
And 4th I will will devise unto my Nephew and
Niece Robt R. Anderson and Winnis C. An-
derson above mentioned all my real estate or what-
ever interest I may hold, have or be entitled to, at
the time of my death, viz the County of Sullivan and
State of Tennessee and wherever to be their property
absolutely, unimpaired by any claims or claims
of others. Whether the said real estate consists of
the whole or the said tract of land upon which I
now live or whether may sell without which I can
easily dispose of wants to no more than two sixths
thereof, no share whatever of interest I may now
possess, have a right to dispose of or receive I give unto
my said nephew and niece Robert R. Anderson

last will and testament.

Will of Peter Rider

Know all men by these presents, That Peter Rider
did make a will between the years of 1860 & 1866 in
which he appointed his son James P. Rider his Executor &
also the death of the said Peter Rider his will came into
the hands of his said Executor James P. Rider who had
said will proved &c in the County Court of Sullivan
County Tennessee the same being left in care of the County
Clerk waiting its maturing of said will. The Court
House was burned and said will was burned with
all other records.

The conditions of the will being such that the heirs
of the said Peter Rider, vizt said said will
by set up &c to be paid what was in substance as
follows to wit: The

bequeathed to his son James P. Rider, on Condition
the following described property, vizt as parcel
of land upon which the said Peter Rider died three
and a half acres and being situated one mile west of
Blountville, comprising the heirs of William R. Anderson
John P. Anderson, James C. Anderson, James P. Anderson &
others in the County and State of Tennessee containing
the Hundred and fifty or more or less, of the
head of his, his head of sheep, three Cows, one small
Moor and four horse, wagon & farming all of which
said land and property he granted said conveyed
