Springer have one Horse and Saddle furnished by my Sons alone

my part to fix Father & Mother's Graves, I will and bequeath
to Immandy C. Springer my fine Apple quilt, Chest
wheel, Coverlid & Calico comfort & factory, Blanket big
Counterpin One Bureau,

I will to Mary Springer One Bed in the Loft and
Rolling Comfort, Sheet & Blanket, that is on the bed
and my Chest & quilt, the Roman Cross, Irish Linen

Brokin Dandy Counterpin a fine Sheet, Table cloth

Elmer's Shall for Sarah C. Springer my Books of all kinds
to Joseph E. Springer My Glass Case is One to Each of the
Gentle of Joseph E. Springer, I will to Elizabeth P. Springer
one pitcher on Blanket One Brush Candle stick my Birds
