The Last will

of Josiah Woods dec'd. Copy of will set up in lieu of original
 & ordered to be recorded September 1st 1879

In the name of God amen I Josiah Woods of the State of
 Tennessee Sullivan County, being for a long time now in health
 but of sound mind and memory, and calling to mind
 the mortality of my body, that all must die do make
 this instrument of writing my last will and testament
 in the following manner to wit

1st I recommend my spirit to God who made it and my
 body to be by my friends buried in a respectable manner
 2nd I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife the oldest
 Gray mare and two other work horses, 3 choice Cows and
 Calves two yearlings Calves six choice killing hogs & brei-
 ing sows and 12 choice all the sheep waggon & teams
 and all the farming utensils all the beds & bedding
 Bridle and saddle & harness and tackings all the
 spinings, wheels large and small and the chest nut all
 the Cabbages 2 Chaffpans one meat barrel 2 vinegar Cags
 or barrels household and kitchen furniture beds headsteds and
 all the bed clothing all the chairs & lock cupboard heavy
 book Case Table all the basin books all the grain that
 is raising and on hand all the hay and flax, logcham
 hand saw 2 augers one chisle candle stand flax beat
 detaching short wind mill all the plank and scauling
 cutting box rife all the poultry 2 fat Cows five short
 sills & cradle moving with the above named property
 is to be for the sole use of my beloved wife and family
 during her natural life or widowhood If my wife should
 marry she is to have a child's part if not marry I want my
 property that is still left at her death to be divided between

my Children equally after giving them their outfit

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary, married one
 saddle & bridle 1 Cow 1 pair of bedsteads worth 3 dollars

4th I give to my son one saddle & bridle one Cow & heifer one
 pair bedsteads worth 3 dollars

5 I give Martha Ann one saddle & bridle one pair of bedsteads
 worth 3 dollars

6th I give Mammat E. one saddle & bridle one Cow & heifer one
 pair bedsteads worth 3 dollars 7th I give Julia one saddle

& bridle one Cow or heifer one pair bedsteads worth 3 dollars

8th I give and bequeath unto Amanda M. one saddle & bridle
 one Cow or heifer also pair bedsteads worth 3 dollars all

the property that is not mentioned I want sold and in the
 first place and all my just debts paid and if any there

any money left after paying my debts I want it to
 be divided equally between my heirs as they become of lawful

age lastly I want my wife while she remains my widow
 to have her home & support off of the plantation and after

her death is she married I will the plantation equally
 between my two youngest girls namely Julia A. Woods

and Amanda M. Woods by paying unto each of these
 ladies fifty dollars each namely Mary M. Woods fifty

dollars unto Isaac M. Woods fifty dollars Martha A.
 Woods fifty dollars and Mammat E. Woods fifty dollars

the payments to be made in good trade at cash price
 at the end of twelve months after then get possession

of the land I nominate and appoint my esteemed friend Eli A.
 Kew executor of this my will to carry the same into

effect

The Last will

of John R. McLanney dec'd. Ordered to be recorded
 County Court November term 1879

I John R. McLanney of the County of Sullivan and State of
 Tennessee do hereby make and publish this my last will

and testament in the manner and form following viz.
It is my will and request that my body be decently
buried in the Grave Yard on my Premises between the
graves of my wife and my son James P. D. Delaney deceased
and that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid by my Executors her executors named with the first
monies of my estate that may come into their hands

I further order and direct that all of my stock farming
implements household and kitchen furniture be sold by my Ex-
ecutors on such Credits as they may direct

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Burkhardt to
her and her heirs forever the land whereon she now lives
including sinking spray lately surveyed and boundaries
marked agreeable to a plat made out by James D. Rhea
then County Surveyor of Sullivan County New York reserving
the lot donated by me to the Methodist Episcopal Church
years ago whereon said Church now stands I also give
unto said Mary Burkhardt and her heirs the note I hold on
her husband James M. Burkhardt for lent money amount
not now collected

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth M. Bu-
dman to her and her heirs forever my Bottom Farm
on the South side of Holston River known as the Cawood.
Bottom containing twenty nine acres more or less

I give and bequeath unto the Children of my Daughter Mary
Burkhardt deceased fifteen hundred dollars jointly three
hundred dollars each to be paid them by my Executors
two years after my decease and no more

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Adeline
Corran and my four sons William P. Delaney Henry M.
Delaney Joseph M. Delaney & Frank M. Delaney the
balance of my estate both real and personal to them
and their heirs forever after deducting all interest that
has or may accrue on William P. Delaney's Note until
two years after my decease

Lastly I nominate and appoint my three sons William
P. Delaney Henry M. Delaney & Joseph M. Delaney Executors
to this my last will and testament hereby revoking and
making void all former wills or gifts by me made in
testimony whereof I have hereunto signed with my
name this 11th day of April 1879 John R. Delaney

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas
as Odell of the County of Sullivan and State of Tennessee being
sensible in body but of sound mind do make and publish this
my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all
other wills by me at any time made.

1st I desire that my funeral expenses and all my just debts
be paid out of any money of which I may be possessed at the
time of my death or that may first come into the hands of my
Executors.

2nd I will and bequeath to my daughter Alice Rutledge wife
of Samuel Rutledge all of a certain tract of land belonging to
me in the 4th Civil Dist. and adjoining the lands of the said
Samuel Rutledge, Joseph Rader and others and containing by
estimation 46 acres be the same more or less

3rd I will and bequeath to my daughter in law Mary Odell
widow of my son William Odell Dec. all of a certain tract of
land belonging to me in the 1st Civil District adjoining the
lands of John McGarry, V. Bridgman and others it being
the land on which the said Mary Odell now lives and con-
taining by estimation 11.6 acres be the same more or less,
to the said Mary Odell during her natural life and then
to her children in equal shares to wit William Odell, Mary
C. Bushong, Isaac Odell Sarah A. Odell and Thomas Odell

4th I will and bequeath to my son David Odell all the
land that I have in the 3rd Civil Dist. the same being in
two tracts of lots but adjoining each other one containing
by estimation 10.8 and the other 50 acres including some
other small surveys and so as to cover all the lands that
I have in said 3rd Dist. making in all 15.8 acres be the
same more or less and adjoining the lands of David Odell on
