The Last will

Copy of will set up in lieu of original
Josiah Woods died. To be recorded September 1st 1879

In the name of God Amen I Josiah Woods of the State of
Minnesota Sullivan County being bind for a long time now in health
but of sound mind and memory and calling to mind
the mortality of my body, that all must die do make
this instrument of writing my last will and testament
in the following manner to wit

I do command my spirit to God who said it and my
body to be by my friends buried in a respectable grave.
I will and bequeath unto my beloved wife the oldest
Gray mare and two other work beasts, 3 choice Cows and
Calves two yearlings Calves six Choice hogs 2 brace
of cows and 12 pigs all the sheep now & gains
and all the farmings utensils at the house & fields
Bridle and saddle & saddle bag and tack things all the
springing wheels large and small and the Check well at
the cabin 2 Chopping axes or mat barrels 2 vases or Cans
or barrels household and kitchen furniture beds headboards and
all the bed clothing all the cheap clocks cupboard bacon
book Case table all the bacon books all the grain that
is raising and on hand all the hay and flax logchain
hand saw 2 axes & a Christ Case Stand floor basket
ditching shovel wind mill all the plank and scalding
Cutting box wife all the poultry 2 fat Cans fine short
Silk & cradle moving with the above named property
as to be for the sole use of my beloved wife and family
hereas the natural life of a widowhood If my wife should
marry she is to have a child's part if not marry I want my
property that is still left at her death to be divided between

my Children equally after giving them their outfit.

3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Marinda one
saddle & bridle 10⁰⁰ 1 pair of bedsteads worth 3 dollars

4th I give to Lucy in one saddle & bridle one cow & heifer one
pair bedsteads worth 5 dollars

5th I give Martha Ann one saddle & bridle one pair of bedsteads
worth 5 dollars

6th I give Hannah & one saddle & bridle one cow & heifer one
pair bedsteads worth 8 dollars 7th I give Julia one saddle & bridle

one cow or heifer one pair bedsteads worth 8 dollars

8th I give and bequeath unto Amanda in one saddle & bridle
one cow or heifer also pair bedsteads worth 8 dollars all

the property that is not mentioned I want sold and in the

first place and all my just debts paid and if any there
is any money left after paying my debts I want it to

be divided equally between my heirs as they become of lawful
age lastly I want my wife while she remains my widow

to have her home & support off of the plantation and after
her death is she to marry & will the plantation equally

between my two youngest girls namely Julia A. Woods
and Amanda M. Woods by paying unto each of them

sixty five dollars each namely Nelly M. Woods fifty
dollars unto Fanny M. Woods fifty dollars Martha A.

Woods fifty dollars and Hannah A. Woods fifty dollars
the payments to be made in good trade at cash price

at the end of twelve months after this get possession
of the land

I nominate and appoint my esteemed friend Eli A.
Klein Executor of this my will to carry the same into
effect

I John R. Delaney of the County of Sullivan and State of
Minnesota do hereby make and publish this my last will

and testament in the manner and form following viz
It is my will and request that my body be interred
buried in the Grave Yard on my premises between the
graves of my wife and my son James P. A. Delaney deceased
and that all of my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid by my executors hereafter named with the first
monies of my estate that may come into their hands
I further order and direct that all of my stock farming
utensils household and kitchen furniture be sold by my ex-
ecutors on such credits as they may direct

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Burkhardt to
her and her heirs forever the land whereon she now lives
including building & yard lately surveyed and boundary
marked agreeable to a plot made out by James D. Rea
then County Surveyor of Sullivan County New York reserving
the lot donated by me to the Methodist Episcopal Church
years ago whereto said church now stands I also give
unto said Mary Burkhardt and her heirs the note I hold on
her husband James W. Burkhardt for last money amount
not now recollect

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth in Bu-
dlemaw to her and her heirs forever my Bottom Farm
on the south side of Holston River known as the Cawood.
Bottom Containing twenty five acres more or less

I give and bequeath unto the children of my daughter Mary
Bushong deceased fifteen hundred dollars forty three
hundred dollars back to be paid them by my executors
two years after my decease and no more

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Adeline
Corvan and my four sons William A. Delaney Henry A.
Delaney Joseph A. Delaney & Frank A. Delaney the
balance of my estate both real and personal to them
and their heirs forever after deducting all interest that
has or may accrue on William A. Delaney's estate until
two years after my decease

Last I nominate and appoint my three sons William
A. Delaney Henry A. Delaney & Joseph A. Delaney executors
to this my last will and testament hereby revoking and
making void all former wills or gifts by me made in
testimony whereof I have hereunto signed with my
name this 17th day of April 1879 John R. Delaney

Thomas Odell Dec'd
Ordered by court to be recorded
County Court January term 1889.

I now all men by these presents that I them-
as Odell of the County of Sullivan and State of New York being
feeble in body but of sound mind do make and publish this
my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void all
other wills by me at anytime made.

I declare that my funeral expenses and all my just debts
be paid out of any money of which I may be possessed at the
time of my death or that may first come into the hands of my
executors.

2nd Will and bequeath to my daughter Alice Kullidge wife
of Daniel Kullidge all of a certain tract of land belonging to
me in the 4th Civil Dist and adjoining the lands of the said
Daniel Kullidge Joseph Kullidge and others and containing by
estimation 40 acres be the same more or less

3rd Will and bequeath to my daughter in law Mary Odell
widow of my son William Odell all of a certain tract of
land belonging to me in the 1st Civil District adjoining the
lands of John M. Garry V. Budleman and others it being
the land on which the said Mary Odell now lives and con-
taining by estimation 108 acres be the same more or less
to the said Mary Odell during her natural life and then
to her children in equal shares to wit William Odell, Mary
Bushong, Isaac Odell Sarah A. Odell and Thomas Odell

4th Will and bequeath to my son David Odell all the
land that I have in the 3rd Civil Dist the same being in
two tracts or lots but adjoining each other one containing
by estimation 108, and the other 50 acres including among
other small surveys and so as to cover all the lands that
I have in said 3rd Dist, making in all 158 acres be the
same more or less and adjoining the lands of David Odell an-
